

D-I Boys Basketball Preview

The road to the Division I boys quarterfinals has been paved with more routs than expected. Five of eight first-round games were decided by double-digits and ditto the round of 16. The most balanced field in many years still has a chance to live up to expectations with the elite eight established.

Here's a look at the combatants, who tangle on Wednesday (Feb. 24) at ASU's Wells Fargo Arena, on to Grand Canyon University for the semis on Friday (Feb. 26) and the finale Monday (Feb. 29) at Gila River Arena:

#1 Corona del Sol (15-8): The Aztecs got busy in the program's "one for the thumb" (bid for a fifth successive title) on Saturday with a 78-58 win over Mountain Pointe. The usual suspects -- Alex Barcello, Saban Lee and Tyrell Henderson -- did the bulk of scoring with 65 of the 78 points. It's been a year of adjustment for Lee and Henderson evolving into top-tier scorers rather than complementary contributors. When the trio's abilities are in synch, the Aztecs are tough to beat. Corona has won seven games in a row and nine of its last 11. The Aztecs are 3-1 against the other quarterfinalists -- wins over Mountain View, Gilbert and Basha and a loss to Mesa. Quarterfinal opponent: Sunnyslope. The teams have not played this season.

#2 Mesa High (23-4): The Jackrabbits opened the tournament with some adversity with the loss of senior guard-forward Darius Goudeau to a horrific knee injury in practice three days before its tourney opener. Goudeau tore his ACL, MCL and meniscus and is done for the season. What that's done is intensify Mesa's focus for the duration. It began with a demolition of Desert Ridge, 61-37, in the round of 16. Picking up the slack for the loss of Goudeau's 18 points and eight rebounds a game were Colter Galante and the Hatch's -- Drew and Mark. They combined for 46 points in beating Desert Ridge. Mesa has won 10 of its last 12 games. The Jackrabbits are 4-1 against the other quarterfinalists -- wins over Corona del Sol, Gilbert, Pinnacle and St. Mary's and a loss to Mountain View. Quarterfinal opponent: St. Mary's. The teams played in early January, Mesa prevailing 72-41.

#3 Basha (22-6): The Bears lost their top player to a knee injury -- skyscraper Klay Stall -- for the season well before it started. Coach Mike Grothaus has effectively mixed and matched the deepest team of the tournament into a title contender nonetheless. Basha dismantled Boulder Creek, 68-45, to begin its tournament run. Basha has size and inside punch (Devin Kirby and Gabe McGlothan) and perimeter threats (Terrell Brown and Antwan Ross-Jones). Basha has won nine of its last 13 games. It's record against the other quarterfinalists is 2-2 -- wins over Mountain View and Gilbert and losses to Corona and St. Mary's. Quarterfinal opponent: Pinnacle. The teams have not played this season.

#4 Gilbert (18-7): The Tigers rank as one of the hottest teams of late with 10 wins in their last 12 games. Seniors Chris Bowling and Jacob Nicolds have been difficult, if not impossible, to contain as Gilbert makes a play for its first title since 2003.

Nicolds was lights-out with 38 points in the playoff opener, an overtime escape from pesky Dobson, 74-65. Gilbert's record against the other quarterfinalists is 1-4 -- a win over Mountain View and losses to Corona, Sunnyslope, Basha and Mesa. Quarterfinal opponent: Mountain View. The teams met Jan. 5 with Gilbert prevailing, 65-52. Nicolds scored 25 that night, hitting from inside and outside.

#5 Mesa Mountain View (17-8): The Toros have won nine straight games dating back to Jan. 18. They rely heavily on senior guard Tommy Kuhse, who averages 23 points a game and has saved the team on numerous occasions with huge scoring nights. Mountain View won its round of 16 game without Kuhse going wild. It's likely with competition amping up the Toros will need balance a time or two more as teams look to neutralize or prevent Kuhse from going off. Forward Zane Jowaiszas is the senior member of the squad, in his third varsity season either as a starter or top reserve. Mountain View is 2-3 against the other quarterfinalists -- wins over Mesa and Pinnacle and losses to Basha, Gilbert and Corona.


#8 Sunnyslope (23-4): The Vikings shed the rust after a frigid first-quarter in its round of 16 game with Chandler. It was Sunnyslope's first game in 15 days. The Vikings trailed 19-9 after the first eight minutes. When the final buzzer sounded they were on the plus side of a 75-53 victory. Multi-sport standout Dane Maggi, a 6-3 guard, is the offensive leader. In the paint it's often Chris Orozco, a 6-5 junior that gets it done. The Vikings are very team-oriented and play good defense. Sunnyslope is 3-0 against quarterfinal teams -- wins over Gilbert, Pinnacle and St. Mary's. They Vikings have won nine of their last 11 and five in a row.

#10 St. Mary's (17-11): The Knights have gained traction as a contender since the middle of January. After blasting Chaparral in the first round they took an overtime thriller from Mountain Ridge, (54-52), in the round of 16. Junior DeShawn Wilson, more a forward by trade, has manned the point and is a handful at a sturdy 6-6. Opponents also have to contend with 6-8 post KJ Hymes, who can shoot from outside. Sophomore guard Erick Rivera is effective from the perimeter as well. St. Mary's is 2-2 against the rest of the elite eight -- wins over Pinnacle and Basha and losses to Mesa and Sunnyslope. The Knights have won 11 of their last 12 games

#22 Pinnacle (12-15): The Pioneers entered the state tournament with the second-worst record in the field, won only four of 14 games from Jan. 1 to the start of postseason and are still three games under .500. They don't care. Pinnacle has dispatched #11 Desert Mountain and #6 Perry to get where it is and are a confident bunch. The Pioneers lost to Desert Mountain and Perry during the season. Senior forwards Nik Mains and AJ Elliot are averaging 13 and 12 points a game, respectively. Freshmen guards Spencer Rattler and Trent Brown are adding nearly seven points a game each. Pinnacle is 0-4 against the rest of the quarterfinal field -- losses to Sunnyslope, Mountain View, St. Mary's and Mesa.




Div. I Boys State Championship Bracket







D-I Girls Basketball Preview

Five of the top eight seeds have survived to the Division I quarterfinals -- #1 Mesquite #2 Valley Vista, #3 Hamilton, #4 Millennium and #5 Desert Vista. Three schools not far down the line have thrown their name in the hat and dare to move on -- #9 Red Mountain, #10 Horizon and #11 Gilbert.

Six of the eight teams in this year's quarters reached the same point or better a year ago. All quarterfinal matchups are the second or third meetings between teams this season. Here's a look at the field, who gather Tuesday (Feb. 23) at Wells Fargo Arena to command future games in the coming week. Semis are Friday (Feb. 26) at Grand Canyon University and the final is Monday (Feb. 29) at Gila River Arena.

#1 Mesquite (23-5): The Wildcats continue to live up to their top-billing. Mesquite ran its winning streak to 14 games in the round of 16 with a 70-49 win over Boulder Creek. Mesquite has not lost since the calendar turned to January. In that streak they've defeated #4 Millennium # 5 Desert Vista in tight games and bludgeoned most others. They defeated #2 Valley Vista in November and D-III #1 Valley Christian last month. Their only Arizona losses are to D-II #1 Seton, #3 Hamilton and #10 Horizon. All those defeats were in late November and early December. Mesquite is led by sophomores Shaylee Gonzales and Lindsey Vanallen, who have each topped the 1,000-point mark in their first two seasons. They combine for 38 points a game. Seniors Izzy Spruit and Alexis Springfield are averaging nine points a game each. Quarterfinal opponent: Red Mountain. Mesquite won earlier meeting, 75-44.

#2 Valley Vista (21-6): The Monsoon are playing some of their best basketball at present. They began this year's title quest with 64-42 win over last year's champ, Dobson, in the round of 16. Valley Vista is 11-1 since Jan. 1. The lone defeat was to Millennium. Like Mesquite, Valley Vista has matured into a bonafide title contender led by sophomore guard Taylor Chavez and junior forward Kiara Edwards. Chavez averages 17 points a game and five assists; Edwards 15 ppg and 10 rebounds. Senior Cerena Reeves chips in 11 ppg. Valley Vista sports a 4-3 record against the rest of the quarterfinal field. Quarterfinal opponent: Horizon. Valley Vista won earlier meeting, 67-36.

#3 Hamilton (23-4): The Huskies have the fewest losses of any team, but two have come in the last three weeks to top-contenders - Valley Vista and Millennium. Something to fret about? We'll see. Hamilton won its round of 16 game handily over Sandra Day O'Connor, 65-44. In its loss to Valley Vista, Hamilton shot poorly, but Valley Vista was better at crunch time. Millennium shot lights out and pulled away in the second half for a rout of the Huskies two weeks ago. Hamilton displays scoring balance led by sophomore guard Maddie Frederick (15 ppg). Senior guard Makayla Filiere (13 ppg), senior guard Payton Whitmore (8 ppg and 4 assists) and junior post Maya Banks (8 ppg and 8 rebounds) can be a tough lineup to defend. Quarterfinal opponent: Gilbert. Hamilton won earlier meeting, 64-38.

#4 Millennium (22-6): The Tigers kryptonite the last three seasons -- Dobson -- can't torment them this year. Dobson defeated Millennium each of the last three postseasons in different rounds. The Tigers were runner-up last year and have battled injury perhaps more than any team remaining in the title chase. The last couple of weeks has seen them back at full strength and wins over Valley Vista and Hamilton attest to that. Millennium reversed one of it losses in the round of 16 by gut-

ting out a 32-27 win over Mountain Pointe. Mountain Pointe dealt Millennium a 45-40 defeat in mid-January. Millennium is in the quarters for the third successive season. The focal point is senior guard Raina Perez (18 ppg, 5 rpg and 4 assists). Senior forward Adriana Zelaya (10 ppg, 6 rpg) has missed the most time due to injury and exciting freshman Dominque Phillips (13 ppg, 6 rpg) combine for a solid trio. Quarterfinal opponent: Desert Vista. Millennium won earlier meeting, 46-44. Millennium upset tournament favorite Desert Vista in last year's semifinals.

#5 Desert Vista (19-6): The Thunder have defeated everyone below them, but no one above them in terms of tournament seeding. Desert Vista's four power-ranking losses are to Mesquite, Valley Vista, Hamilton and Millennium. New coach Cheyan Wilson's team got off to a good start with their round of 16 win over Liberty, 49-37. They have a score to settle with Millennium with the loss in last year's semis and a December outing (52-45) earlier this year. Returning players from last year's semifinalist have led the charge. Seniors Tatum Brimley and Toni Davis are the scoring leaders at 15 ppg and 11 ppg, respectively. Brimley adds five assists per game and Davis seven rebounds. Junior Madison Golla and senior Kylee Donahue average 8 ppg. Desert Vista has won its last six games and 12 of its last 13.


#9 Red Mountain (17-11): The Mountain Lions have enjoyed a run of late, winning six of their last eight games. The latest a round of 16 win over Highland, 47-33. It's their first trip to the quarters since 2007 when they won the D-I title. Red Mountain got an added bonus as the #9 seed earning a first-round bye, which happened this year because only 23 teams compete in D-I. Senior guard Seneca Richards leads a youthful starting lineup that features a sophomore and two freshmen. Richards is averaging 16 points a game. Red Mountain's Achilles heel is knocking off higher-seeded teams. The Mountain Lions are 0-4 against the quarterfinal field and beat only one top-10 seeded team this season -- Highland.

#10 Horizon (16-12): The Huskies have the worst record of the elite eight, but own a win over Mesquite from early December. They are in the quarters for the second year in a row. Horizon's play has been a bit uneven. The second half of the regular season they were 7-6 and have posted tournament wins over Mesa Mountain View (59-24) and No. 7 Xavier (48-37). Guard Leah Goodman is the catalyst. The senior supplies a good all-around game and good perimeter shooting. She's averaging 14 ppg and 4 assists. Senior post Katie Grant is the inside threat (10 ppg and 9 rpg). Three freshmen -- Alyssa Alverez, Jayce Carter and Madison Cabardo -- have boosted the offense combining for 23 points a game.

#11 Gilbert (19-10): The Tigers haven't been in the quarterfinal mix since 2010. This will be their first winning season since 2010. They've won two playoff games - Chandler (59-37) and Chaparral (63-58 OT). The latter reversed two earlier double-digit losses to the Firebirds. Gilbert returned four players with significant playing time from last year -- Shayla Huskey, Lucy Guerrette, Tessa Kowalski and Tiffany Hurd. They've been joined by freshmen twins -- Hanna and Haley Cavinder. The Cavinders are averaging 14 points a game each and supply Gilbert with a potent perimeter threat. Haley Cavinder tallied 26 points in the overtime win over Chaparral. Both Cavinders are shooting 35 percent from three-point range. Kowalski led Gilbert in scoring last year and is next in scoring this year behind the Cavinders. Gilbert is 1-5 against the quarterfinal field with its lone win against Red Mountain.

Shadow Mountain made it to the semifinal round last year while the Eagles came up short in the quarterfinal round. Both teams were knocked out by eventual state champion Gilbert Christian.

No. 4 Paradise Valley (23-4) vs. No. 21 Nogales (18-10), 2:30 p.m. Three years removed from a state title, longtime head coach Mark MacGowan has the Trojans

back in the hunt again. The Trojans are riding their fifth 22-plus win season in a row. Senior CJ VanBeekum is leading the team with almost 18 points a game and junior Dominic Rogiers is scoring over 11 a game.



Senior Elijah Thomas has almost 19 points a game.



Div. II Boys State Championship Bracket







No. 1 Seton Catholic (29-1) vs. No. 8 Maricopa (23-6), 7:45 p.m. Karen Self has guided Seton Catholic to seven state titles and four second place finishes since 1996 including a 52-49 loss to Maricopa in the Division II title game last year. A playoff rematch this early in the state bracket is unfortunate but it still might be filled with drama although the Sentinels took care of Maricopa 76-36 in early January.

Seton is led by sophomore Sarah Barcello (16.3 points per game) and junior sisters Jenn and LeeAnne Wirth. The Wirth sisters are two of only five 2017 prospects listed by ESPN with Jenn earning four stars.

Kati Burrows led the Rams to the title in her first and last year with the program because her alma mater came calling and Burrows took an assistant coaching job with Montana State. In a strange coincidence, Montana State graduate Melvin Mitchell was hired to replace Burrows. The Rams returned seven players from last year's team including Raegene Womack.

No. 2 Cactus Shadows (26-4) vs. No. 7 Arcadia (23-7), 6:00 p.m. The Falcons and Titans failed to get out of the second round last year but one is guaranteed a trip to the semifinal round this year. Cactus Shadows lost twice to teams from out of state and head coach Richie Willis has taken the team from only five wins four years ago to the best performance since 2008 when the Falcons finished with 27 wins and a trip to the semifinal round.

Bryce Nixon leads Arcadia with over 20 points a game but the Titans fell to Cactus Shadows 53-28 in the regular season and 62-45 in the Section III championship game.

No. 3 Sierra Linda (29-3) vs. No. 6 Prescott (22-5), 4:15 p.m.

Sierra Linda made it to the quarterfinals last year while Prescott made it to the second round. The Bulldogs have never played for a state title while Prescott made one appearance in 1981. Desirae Carranza is in her fourth year at Sierra Linda and her win in the second round was her 100th of her career. Janae Gonzales leads the team with over 19 points a game.

First-year Prescott coach Bobbi Yoder already has one of the best records in recent program history. Ava Maneval and Mackenzie Grauberger came up big for the Badgers in the second round and they will have to do it again to continue the dream season.



No. 2 seed Snowflake is the defending champ but already lost to No. 1 seed Estrella Foothills, which lost in the regular season to No. 5 seed Mingus. And don't forget about No. 3 Scottsdale Christian, which defeated Estrella Foothills early in the season in double overtime.

But the lower seeds also have the potential to pull off some upsets.

No. 5 Mingus (23-7) vs. No. 4 Winslow (24-7), 9:00 a.m.: Mingus started to turn the corner after its winter break. It's a very balanced squad with depth. It's only college-bound player, senior captain Evan Snyder, broke his jaw in practice just before the regular season ended. The team still defeated two teams, including No. 1 seed Estrella Foothills, without Snyder, one of four players who averages seven or more points per game. Mingus loves to run and shoot from beyond the arc. Senior guard Ashton Loring (5.3 assists per game) is the team's floor leader, but guards Fabian Navarro and Issac Escalante also help control the tempo for Mingus. "Our team has been successful this year because players have bought in to the idea of playing for each other instead of for themselves," Mingus coach David Beery said. "We have also been confident and have fun while we play and practice." Winslow lost 77-66 at Mingus on Dec. 16. Seniors Dalvin Benally, Akkeem Foster and Nathan Hanley are averaging double digits in scoring. Benally and Hanley are shooting over 50 percent for Winslow.

No. 6 Window Rock (27-9) vs. No. 3 Scottsdale Christian (24-4), noon: Senior captains Corbin Lenderink and Sam Ortega can score, but their contributions in other areas also helped Scottsdale Christian "tremendously" this season. The team also is receiving a big boost from a couple of freshmen, Reed Myers (12.5 ppg) and Ethan Spry (12.1 ppg), the team's leading scorers. "They are really freshmen only in name," coach Bob Fredricks said. "Their work habits and game quality are among the best on the team. The four players mentioned put the off-season time in, working on their shot and overall game quality." Scottsdale Christian is tall and long this season, qualities it doesn't tend to possess. "Even though we have had five previous championship teams, none have played a schedule this challenging," Fredricks said. Tyrese Brown (12 points, 8.8) rebounds per game) and Shammond Goodman (14 ppg, 50% shooter) are the stat leaders for Window Rock. Scottsdale Christian has three players as tall as about 6-6 and three more who are around 6-4. Window Rock has about four players who


No. 10 North Canyon (19-10) vs. No. 2 Snowflake (29-3), 3:00 p.m.: North Canyon's dedicated coach, Michael O'Guinn, is finally experiencing the fruits of a winning season. In O'Guinn's eight years, North Canyon's highest win season total prior to this season was eight games. "We play with anger and with a chip on our shoulder," O'Guinn said. "We play to earn respect and bring pride to our North Canyon community. The

players genuinely love each other and respect each others' strengths. They want to start a tradition of excellence at North Canyon." Caleb Cota, Charles Howard and football stars John Okwoli and Austin Jackson are helping their team get noticed. "All of those guys possess something special," O'Guinn said. "Caleb is by far the most skilled player on the team. However, he is very humble and keeps the team loose. Charles is an exceptional athlete that takes pride in defending the other teams' best option. He is the most mature player on our team and the players respect his voice. John is a just a competitor. The kid doesn't accept losing and pushes others to feel the same. Austin is just a beast, big and strong with great feet in the post, which poses matchup problems." For Snowflake, the postseason is old hat. In fact, it's the defending D-III champ and has won 25 or more games in each of its previous five seasons under coach Andy Wood. This year's team is centered around three seniors, Kurt Wood, Jordan Gardner and Kegan Bjorn. Each one contributed to last year's title run. Wood, a three-year player, is perhaps the most underrated player in Arizona this year, assistant coach Mike Solomon said in an e-mail. "Kurt leads by both word and deed," Solomon wrote. "I think his greatest strength is his court vision." Wood is in the top-20 nationally in assists per game average (9), according to maxpreps' national stats. Gardner is the "sparkplug" and leads the team in rebounding, steals and points. "I have never seen a kid with so much competitiveness," Solomon said. He's only 6-1, 190, but Bjorn is the "man-child" of the team because of his jumping ability and tough assignments. Bjorn will likely guard North Canyon's Jackson (6-6, 270) during the game. "Head coach Andy Wood and staff use and teach a system that deliberately involves all five players on the court," Solomon said.

No. 9 Cibola (24-6) vs. No. 1 Estrella Foothills (27-3), 6:00 p.m.: Devonte Evans, a 6-4 wing player, is receiving interest from junior college and Division II programs. The senior is averaging 18 points and eight boards per game. Not far behind is Michael Gazda (12 points, 6 boards, 5 assists per game). But the duo also receives a lot of help from five other players who are averaging between 5-6 points per game. Having that many bodies contributing allows the team to run the floor a lot. Hats off to head coach Ronald Bratton and his staff for leading their program to their best regular season in the past 26 years. Five of the teams six losses came against D-I Basha and Dobson, a D-I Nevada playoff team, Desert Oasis, and D-II annual playoff contender Copper Canyon. "We have to try to play a challenging schedule," Bratton said. Estrella Foothills is an experienced team that has won its section in three of the past four seasons. Seniors Rex Greabell, Antaveus Brown and Joe Logan have won 80-plus games during their careers at Estrella Foothills. That experience helped pull the squad through its second round game, when poor ball handling almost derailed the team. The 6-7 Greabell and Brown, a swing man who will likely matchup with Cibola's Evans, are Estrella Foothills' leaders. Greabell is a threat down low but can also shoot from the outside. Brown also is an inside-outside threat. Logan does a lot of the dirty work for Estrella Foothills. Point guard Ricky Robinson has a 6-to-1 assist to turnover ratio per game. Graebell's brother, Grant, is averaging 13 points per game. "They have traded in their individual egos for the collective one." coach Rich Gutwein said. "They take exceptional pride in defending as a team."

Hunter is the team's leading rebounder, third leading scorer and brings a "fierce" competitive attitude. Eagleman defends the opponent's top scorer, runs the break well and can shoot. "Boy, can she shoot," Pinon coach Peterson Butler said. Nacona is the team's floor leader. "She has a very good attitude and best of all she is very coachable," Butler said. Yazzie is the team's quiet leader and also a "deadly" shooter. Yazzie also brings a tough defensive presence. Most of Chinle's girls have been in coach Butler's system since they were freshmen. "One of their goals was to be competitive with the elite teams in our section and to be a force," Butler said. "They accomplished these goals and were able to compete in the section championship for the first time ever. It took a while for the community to realize that we had a good team. 

The general is Galindo, a versatile player with "great handles," shooting ability and defensive smarts. Loya is an aggressive shooter who set a new state record with 17 threes in a game this season. She's also a quick defender and attacks the basket "with no hesitation." Loya's versatility allows her to play out of position since Galindo and Reyes handle the 1 and 2 guard positions. Pueblo's talented trio have played with or against each other since their elementary and middle school days. "I don't have one selfish player on my team," Pueblo coach Ismael Galindo said. "They truly play for each other. They're best friends off the court. They work extremely hard on the fundamental every day in practice and all of off season. They play the game for fun. My team is always smiling." South Mountain is led by Gatorade Player of the Year candidate Najiyyah Pack and another senior with playoff experience, Ozahria Fisher. The captains for Page are senior Ashley Dempsey (team-high 13.1 ppg), junior Ariel Austin and sophomore LeLisa Watson. "The team really feeds off of (Dempsey) on the offensive end of the floor," Smith said. Austin is the defensive leader and is second on the team with 47 steals. Freshman Myka Taliman is the steals leader (58) for Page. "She (Austin) doesn't really get much recognition, because she is our defensive specialist, but she is very key to our success," Smith said. Watson was a clutch player during some big games this year. Taliman is playing the point and continues to grow every game. "Our team's success this year and every year has been based on our defense," Smith said. "If we play good defense, good things happen for us. We pride ourselves on playing good defense and playing for our teammates. We put the team above ourselves." Window Rock lost 66-33 to Page this season, but that's when Page was at full strength. Domonique Chee only averages 11.7 points per game as the Window Rock's high scorer, but three other players are averaging 8.6 points or more per game. No. 9 seed Winslow (17-16) vs. No. 1 Valley Christian (28-2), 7:30 p.m.: Record wise, this is the worst season the Winslow Lady Bulldogs have experienced in more than a decade. But because of its rich basketball tradition, opponents aren't feeling sorry for Winslow this year. Not when Winslow is in the midst of another strong playoff run. The Lady Bulldogs, which carry just one senior, captain Adrianna Singer, and four freshmen, were 9-15 after a 51-50 loss to Holbrook, which finished 14-16 this season. During that tough opening stretch of the season, Winslow also was handed a 62-33 drubbing by Valley Christian. Four players scored in double figures for Valley Christian in that game, including sophomore Anna Gorman, who tallied 21 points. But since that loss to Holbrook, Winslow has won eight of its last nine games. Junior Megan Timmer was shooting 56 percent after 29 games while averaging a team-high 17.1 points per game for Valley Christian. After winning back-toback state championships, the playoffs haven't been kind to Valley Christian in the past four seasons, when the program was upset by a lower seed in each tournament.


