

Ray Is Looking to Triplicate Past Two Years

Ray's softball coach this season was new, the third different head coach is as many seasons,

During the week of the team's first game this season, Ray only had three players practicing, as a handful of their teammates were playing volleyball for Ray in the playoffs.

But those were minor distractions for the power house softball program. For proof, in its first two games, Ray outscored its opponents 48-1.

Backed by strong community and parent support and youth softball experience, Ray has shown it is well-equipped to handle any curveball thrown its way. In the past two years, nothing has kept them from reaching their goal, and Ray's players came into this season wanting to triplicate the past two seasons.

If it wins out, Ray can become just the second 1A Conference program to win three championships in a row since 1976, when the Arizona Interscholastic Association introduced 1A softball. Up next is Mogollon on May 4 at Rose Mofford in the state quarterfinals.

"I inherited all of this," first-year coach Rachel Mawson said. "I don't want to take credit. I am thankful for the parents, fans and the community. I couldn't do anything without them."

Mawson was somewhat of a late softball hire, but that didn't keep her from making her mark on this year's team.

She earned 12 varsity letters while starring at Miami High, where she also coached softball from 2014-16, and played softball at Southern Virginia University. Since Mawson also coached Ray's volleyball team, adapting to the new softball coach didn't take long for the players who played for Mawson on the volleyball team.

"Coach trusts us," junior Daniella Hinojos said.

Mawson lets two of her stars, Hinojos and junior catcher Tara Lorona to call their own game, and the plan is paying off.

In 1A, Hinojos is ranked third in ERA (1.47), second in strikeouts (179 in 140 innings) and first in wins (21).

"(Hinojos) has six pitches, and even on a bad day she's plenty strong," Mawson said. "She has decent speed and is in the high 50s, low 60s if she is upset."

We don't know if getting upset also helps Lorona, but something is clicking for her.

She is second on the team with a .532 batting average. This season, Ray's players likely have had to lean on each other more than they have in the previous two years.

Without disclosing personal details, Mawson explained.

"Every single kid it seems has gone throw something that has changed her life," the coach said. "It's been a challenging year, but they have grown a lot. Having this softball family, they know it's a safe place to go to."

That welcoming environment has helped two new starters fill the biggest holes on the team before the season started, first baseman Danny Montano (.365 batting average) and centerfielder Shelby Yocum.

Yocum is a sophomore who is batting .310 despite not playing softball since she was in sixth grade and uses her track speed to track down a lot of fly balls.

The team also welcomed four freshmen this season, including Marissa Barragan, who was batting .429 after 14 games. There are only three seniors, including Montano and Ema Alvarado (.438 average), on the team this season, but don't overlook their contributions.

One of those seniors also is one of the state's hitting threats, Janae Ruiz (.605 average).

"I couldn't do it without my teammates," Ruiz said.

Off he field, the team is also stepping up.

Mawson reports that her roster is filled with with 'A' and 'B' students who haven't missed a game due to low grades. That's a good thing, because although it one of the favorites, Ray's path toward another championship ring is expected to get tougher from here on out.

One of those teams that might get in Ray's way of making history is its No. 1 rival, Superior, which is about 30 minutes away from Ray. The recent playoff history between the schools:

Top-seeded Ray defeated No. 2 Superior 1-0 in the final last year.

In 2015, Superior defeated Ray in the quarters on its way to the winning the ring.

In 2014, Ray defeated Superior in the quarterfinals.

So it's easy to guess which two programs earned the top state seeds this season. No. 1 Superior (19-2) and No. 2 Ray (21-2).

The teams split their two games this season, and if they meet again it'll be in the May 8 final at Arizona State.

The rivalry reminds Mawson of the Miami-Globe showdowns she used to participate in.

"It's almost as fun as Globe-Miami," Mawson said. "It's a healthy rivalry. The girls on both teams know each other. Some are cousins. It's fierce competition, and then they say 'hi' after the game."

May 4 quarterfinal preview. All games at 4 p.m. at Rose Mofford.

No. 10 Mogollon (9-13) vs. No. 2 Ray (21-2): Mogollon defeated Mayer 6-2 in the first round. "After losing six starters from last year's season and facing some injuries, we finally found our groove," first-year coach Taralee Porter said. "I love how much they have grown and progressed throughout the season. We don't have any seniors, so it will be nice to come back with a full roster next year. Lauren Hancock has 27 RBI's, and Hannah Ballesteros has 32. They also make a strong pitching and catching combo."

Mogollon lost 10 of its first 12 games but has won seven of its past eight games.

No. 8 St. Michael (17-5) vs. No. 1 Superior (19-2): Superior's team batting average is .428 and ERA is 1.86. Senior Alicia Arriola is 18-0 in the circle. Anisah Cardenas, Arriola and Tori Juarez are each hitting .500 or better. It's been a long time since St. Michael has reached the playoffs and had a winning record. Seven of its 13 players are either freshmen or sophomores.

No. 12 St. David (10-10-1) vs. No. 4 Williams (17-6): St. David pulled off the biggest upset in the first round after defeating Valley Union 6-4. Nine of St. David's players are either sophomores or freshmen. Two of those sophomores, Jaylin Richardson and Kyra Richardson, are the team's leading hitters. Jaylin has also struck out 89 batters in 85 1.3 innings. Williams has won at least 18 games in a season only once in the past decade.

No. 6 Hayden (12-14) vs. No. 3 Bagdad (17-8): Hayden's program has never missed the playoffs since the program opened about 36 years ago. "Our team this year is led by seniors Brandi Lopez, Jaden Gonzales and sophomore Ahleah Arbizo," 12-year coach Gene Westrope said. "We are a very young team. We have three seniors and the rest of the team are freshmen and sophomores. It took us a while to get going with so many young players."

Bagdad has hit a 1A best 29 home runs. "We know that 1A has been dominated by Ray and Superior, and rightfully so," Bagdad coach Dalton Mills said. "We feel we have the maturity to take our team further this year." Bagdad has not won more than playoff game in a state tournament since 2011. Bethany Loveall is batting .580.




2A Softball Championship Bracket





2A Softball Tournament Preview

Benson is on the verge of revisiting a championship dynasty that once was. The Bobcats averaged 29 wins a year from 2006 to 2011 and took home three state championships (2006, 2008, 2011), a runner-up finish (2010) and a semifinal showing (2007) along the way. A quarterfinal result in 2009 was the only "glitch" in that streak.

The Bobcats shifted up to a reconfigured Division III after 2011 and the result was three straight quarterfinal finishes followed by a second-round setback in 2015. A move back to D-IV in 2016 resulted in a semifinal finish and a return to the top of 2A softball with a state championship in 2017. With a record of 29-1-1 this spring, it's no wonder the Bobcats have earned the top seed in the 2018 2A state tournament.

Longtime assistant coach Yogi Wilson is in his second year as the helm of the Bobcats and he has seen it all in his 15 years with the program.

"Our playoff history is something that we are proud of," Wilson said. "We have qualified for the tournament every year since 2003. In that 15-year span we have reached nine final fours and never lost a first round game. We have gone 4-1 in championship games and have an overall playoff record of 34-11."

Wilson feels his current squad is the best offensive lineup the program had ever fielded.

"Our team batting average has been hovering around .500 for much of the season," Wilson added. "We have belted over 50 homeruns as a team and scored over 450 runs this season." The Bobcats are led by seniors Emmarae Wilson and Hope

Adams, juniors Katie Sherman and Abby Workman and freshman Emily Darwin.

Let's take a look at some of the teams ready to take on the Bobcats:

No. 2 Camp Verde (22-6): The Cowboys finished in the semifinal round last year after earning a runner-up trophy in 2016 but the team lost two important pieces to graduation. Kayla Hackett batted .568 with 31 RBI, 10 doubles, three triples and four home runs last year and Madison Johnson batted .566 with 32 RBI, 12 doubles, a triple and two home runs. Still, there was plenty left in the tank for head coach Henry Smith and he just reloaded.

Freshman Jenna Huey is batting an incredible .628 with 28 RBI, 15 doubles, two triples and three home runs, sophomore Jacy Finley is hitting .583 with 42 RBI, 17 doubles and three home runs. Finley is also leading her team from the circle for the second year in a row with 18 wins and 205 strikeouts in 127 innings pitched. Finley went 16-7 last year with 165 strikeouts as a freshman.

No. 3 Willcox (21-9): The Cowboys lost to the Benson three times this year by lopsided scores of 13-0, 7-1 and 10-2 and Benson beat Willcox 4-1 in the first round of the state playoffs last year. In fact, the last time Willcox beat Benson was in the 2010 state championship game. 19 straight losses have followed.

Mike Patterson was the head coach when the Cowboys were on even par with their rivals and Trevor Ward was his assistant. This year, Ward is in his first year at the helm of the Cowboys and Patterson is his assistant. Under those circumstances, getting past Benson might be possible.

"The team has been successful this year in part to the offseason workouts in the gym, making commitments to the team and not the individual." Ward explained. Ward lists senior Hope Lee and junior Samantha Kortsen as his team leaders.

No. 4 Morenci (18-10): The Wildcats lost to Benson 12-3 on April 23 and 6-1 in March. Joe Garcia is in his second year with Morenci and his team is led a by a trio of seniors. Shaunee Seballos is batting .571 with 30 RBI, 12, doubles, 10 triples and three home runs, Destiny Apodaca is hitting .539 with 29 RBI, 16 doubles, four triples and a home run, and Alexis Gregory is batting .519 with 37 RBI, 13 doubles and five home runs. Junior Jamiee Rodriguez has 31 RBI with five home runs and she leads the team with 17 wins and 122 strikeouts.

No. 5 Bourgade Catholic (19-8): The Golden Eagles lost to Benson in the state championship game last year. JinHee Huff has been the head coach Bourgade Catholic since 2005, winning it all in 2012.

"We have strong leadership and a positive outlook," Huff said on her current team. "We set goals and work very hard on effective communication. Our team has drive and faith in our journey to be state champs!"

Huff lists Alexia Flores, Rachel Hammons, Mallory McDowell, Emme Maciel and Daisy Hernandez as her team leaders.

"We work hard to learn about ourselves and how to develop into strong, powerful, confident women who can self advocate and believe in their abilities," Huff added. "We contribute to our community with a service project to feed the homeless on an annual basis, and we participated in the DBacks Race Against Cancer this spring. We believe in the aspect of bonding and being respectful and kind to one another on and off the field by practicing a constant and consistent contact with one another during the entire season."

No. 6 Paradise Honors (15-5): Paul Hatcher is in his third year with the Panthers. The team lost to Benson in the quarterfi-

nal round last year after guiding the team to the first playoff victory in program history.

"Our team has been successful because we have 14 young women on the same page," Hatcher noted.

Freshman Ledezma Romero is batting .604 and senior Katie Hatcher has 45 RBI, 16 doubles, three triples and three home runs. Hatcher also has 10 wins from the circle.

No. 7 Trivium Prep (20-5): Jennifer Luque started the softball program at the school last year and she has them in the playoffs as a top-seed in two years.

"Three years ago, a group of girls wanted to play softball but we were not large enough to form a team, Luque said. "Three girls tried out for the baseball team and made it. During that time, they asked if I would still work with them on their softball skills and I agreed. Last year was the first time our high school had a softball team and I graciously accepted the challenge as head coach. Our team consisted of our three "Originals" and the rest were freshman. This year we have only gotten stronger and have been consistent both offensively and defensively."

Luque's team leaders are Ashton Holt, Cara Lozon, Brenna Taylor and Corinne Vasiloff. "Our softball community is a family," she added. "We play for each other and this attitude has created an environment that keeps us all excited to be on the field.

No. 8 Kingman Academy (22-7): The Tigers lost in the first round last year and the 22 wins this year is the most ever by the young program. Senior Maryssa Edwards leads the team with a .561 batting average and 34 RBI. Freshman Lynsey Day has two home runs. Edwards and fellow senior Jessica Plew share pitching duties and the pair have combined for 194 strikeouts.





In Wide-Open Field, Empire Tries Defending Its Title

Two of the last three years Empire has emerged as the 3A/Division III state champion. Those titles were in 2015 and 2017. The 2016 season was convoluted with plenty of schools moving up or down and some not belonging where they ended up. Wasn't your typical 3A field.

This year the conference makeup is the same as last year. Many of the top competitors are back to give the top spot another go. Empire is one of them.

Over the last six years the highest seeded team to win the title has been a #5 seed twice. Last year Empire was a #12 seed. Anything can happen.

The following is a capsule glance of the state quarterfinalists:

#1 River Valley is the tournament's No. 1 seed and seems like it hasn't lost a West Region title in forever. Last season the Dust Devils took the top seed to the semis only to fall to pesky Empire, 7-5. The year before eventual champ Catalina Foothills ousted them in the semis. The return trip in 2018 is promising with senior Ashley Carter-Marshall putting up huge numbers at the plate and in the circle. Carter-Marshall is hitting .495 with eight homers and 45 RBI. She is 14-1 with a 1.01 ERA. Other top bats include Tianna Williams (.582 avg, 8 HR, 50 RBI), Korbyn Draper (.554 avg., 38 RBI) and Ryann Glenn (.480 avg., 37 RBI).

#2 Casteel has used another year and some extra bodies with three classes to choose from to aid its rise in softball. They bowed out in the first round a year ago to Sabino, which reached the semis. This year they ascended to 3A Metro Region champs -- one spot higher than the year before. They have a good opportunity to grab the school's third state title this year -- football and girls soccer did so in the fall and winter, respectively. Junior Lael Swank leads a potent offense on paper with a .629 average and 22 doubles. A freshman -- Morgan Norris -- has brought a .510 average. Players

hitting .400 or better are the norm for the Colts. In the circle Rachel Sultzbach and Kate Wagner have combined for 23 wins with 14-2 and 9-2 records, respectively. Sultzbach sports a 2.73 ERA.

#3 Show Low is another school itching for a long run at state. The Cougars were the No. 3 seed last year and lost in the first round to Sahuarita, 4-2. No shame in that as Sahuarita is usually in the mix. Show Low won the 3A East for the second year in a row so they want more hardware. Veteran players Paige Kerr (.586), Haley Housley (.444) and Megan Reidhead (.321) are catalysts. The big year offensively has come from freshman Addie Clark -- .468 average, 12 homers, 14 doubles and 38 RBI. Senior Lauren Clark has logged the most work in the circle with seven wins and a 3.05 ERA.

#5 Winslow has endured some highs and lows this season. At present it is on the upswing. After a strong showing at the Gracie Haught Invitational in Payson, the Bulldogs went on to a tourney in Las Vegas where their fortunes and fielding turned sour. The last two weeks have seen a resurgence with the team posting six wins in its last seven games. Leading Winslow are seniors Harleigh Scott and Morgan Thomas. Scott is batting .465 and Thomas .520 with eight homers and 43 RBI. Winslow last won a state softball title in 2014 and were runners-up in 2013. They've been in the mix the last few years except 2106 when they were moved up to D-II and still posted a 19-12 record. Winslow lost in the first round last year to eventual champ Empire.

#7 Empire won a spirited three-team battle for the South Region title winning it via tiebreaker with Sabino and Sahuarita. The Ravens return several key players from last year's title run led by five seniors -- Hannah Brink, Emma Garbutt, Emylee Perry, Anbel Ramirez and Jaden Romero. Romero finished the regular season throwing a shutout vs. Pusch Ridge and tamed Yuma Catholic in last year's 3A title game. Although only 5-6 this year with a 3.50 ERA, she's a big-game pitcher. Perry leads the staff with a 6-1 record and 2.57 ERA. Perry is batting .384 with a team-high 32 RBI. Garbutt is hitting .352 with 22 RBI. Ramirez's average is .364 and leads the team in home runs with four.

#9 Page ruled the 3A North this season posting a 17-10 record after finishing second in the region in 2017. The Sand Devils were eliminated in the first round last year by eventual runner-up Yuma Catholic. They are led by pitcher sophomore Shelby Blake and her work in the circle. Blake boasts a 2.22 ERA, an 8-3 record and has 136 strikeouts in 94 innings. Sophomores Mikenna Penrod and Christina Lucero hit a combined .400 and Tyanna Kelly brings the most power with four homers, 12 extra-base hits and a team-best 24 RBI.

#11 Sahuarita is led by veteran coach Chris Fanning, who is in his second stint as head man -- 23 seasons total. The Mustangs have 500 wins-plus under Fanning's leadership, made the playoffs 21 of the 23 years and played in title games eight times winning twice. "We have been successful because we have played excellent defense, hit well and our pitchers have thrown strikes and kept us in ball games", Fanning said. "this is the best hitting team I've coached.." Seniors Cheyenne Fox and Aviana Alvarez are finishing their careers on a high note. Fox has pitched well (6-2 with a 2.90 ERA) and hitting .435; Alvarez is raking at a .430 clip. Juniors Hailey Tanori and Solymar Navarro are having huge years. Tanori is hitting .606 with 66 hits and Navarro .460 with a team-high 54 RBI.

#13 Chino Valley upended #4 Safford to reach the elite eight. The Cougars have a two-way standout in senior Keigan Willingham. Willingham is 10-7 in the circle and has fanned 141 batters in 106 innings. She is batting a sizzling .638 with 24 RBI. Willingham already has a win under her belt as a pitcher in the tourney vs. Safford and slugged a homer in the game as well. Sophomore Jacey Buchanan is hitting .500 and junior Madison Hooper is raking at .473 with a team-high 25 RBI.
