

Ray, Bagdad Continue Championship Search

The quest for a 1A Conference championship for No. 1-seeded Ray and and No. 2 Bagdad continues.

The two programs got close in the past couple of years, but this may be their final good shot at finally raising the championship trophy. Ray and Bagdad start the veteran leadership that's needed to pull teams through the tough postseason moments.

But this is the final hurrah for those seniors. One of those seasoned vets is one of the all-time best players to suit up for a 1A school, Bagdad's Israel Loveall.

He's already helped Bagdad win a football champion and set a national passing touchdown career record. Can Loveall the pitcher/hitter now help deliver a baseball title?

1A first-round preview


Games at Goodyear Baseball Complex May 4 No. 16 Mayer (7-17) vs. No. 1 Bagdad (19-6):

Mayer is one of four teams from the Central Region that reached the playoffs. It did so with its fourth different head coach in the past five seasons. Sr. INF/RHP Dylan Wilhide, a career .415 hitter, is batting .574 this season and carries a 2.14 ERA after 41 1/3 innings. Mathew Bywater (.474 ave.) is Mayer's second leading hitter. Brent Callen served 13 years as an assistant at Bagdad before taking over this season. Loveall is 4-1 in nine appearances, with a 1.65 ERA in 46.2 innings and 74 strikeouts. The senior is also totting a .597 ave. with 44 RBI's and 8 homers. Bagdad's team ERA is 2.26. "Our success this year comes from the team's dedication to always work hard and a focus on the little things that separate a good team from a great team," Callen said. "No matter the team we are playing, the team takes the same approach with every at bat, every pitch and every defensive play. Each player is willing to do what ever is asked to make the team successful."

No. 9 San Pasqual (12-9) vs. No. 8 Valley Union (9-13): San Pasqual lost four of its first give games but won five of its last six games to make the playoffs under longtime coach Faron Owl. Owl's team finished second in the West Region, losing its only two region games to No. 1 Bagdad. San Pasqual, located in Winterhaven, Calif., has posted double digit win seasons in the past five seasons. Valley Union was the state runner-up last year as the No. 3 seed. This season, if the maxpreps amount is correct, Valley Union

leads the state in stolen bases with 198. Valley Union senior C/P Derek Hahn leads 1A with a .625 ave. Hahn has also logged 76 K's in 58.2 innings. Soph. Erubiel Sierras (.508 ave.), Jr. Garrett Sonke (.434 ave.) and Sr. Kalen Richardson (.429 ave.) also are producing for Valley Union at the plate.

No. 12 Ft. Thomas (9-10) vs. No. 5 Williams (18-8): Ft. Thomas was 0-18 three years ago, but 12th-year coach Chris Rubio and his program kept grinding. They reached the playoffs this season for the first time since 2010. "We have been successful this year behind solid pitching and timely consistent hitting," Rubio said. "It seems whenever we need a solid inning to score a few runs to either pad a lead or come from behind we have been able to do so." The leaders of Rubio's team are Jr. P Kendall Stanly (.571 ave., 24 RBI's), Sr. Jay Anderson (.400 ave.), and So. C Todd Stringfellow (.432 ave.). Williams dropped its last game of the regular, 6-0, to Bagdad, snapping an eight game win

streak. Jr. P Frankie Kramer is 8-4 with a 2.37 ERA, with seven complete games. Sr. Zack Perkins (.444 ave.) has struck out only four times in 93 plate appearances. If the stats are correct on maxpreps.com, Williams has stolen 120 bases.

No. 13 Anthem Prep (8-9) vs. No. 4 St. David (9-10): Fourth-year coach/athletic director Richard Watmore and his Anthem Prep program followed their first ever postseason appearance last year with another playoff season. It did so with only one catcher and lack of arms on the mound. "A lot of perseverance and hard work along with teamwork and believing in themselves went into this season," Watmore said. Jr. Preston Blackledge, Sr. captain Matt Beeman and jr. Zach Kuchta (.509 ave.) are Anthem Prep's threats. St. David has been playing with just nine hard-working players after losing a handful of seniors off the 2017 team. It also lost its starting 3B to a foot injury. "They are a pleasure to coach," said 10th-year coach Ronald Goodman about this St. David team. "I am also blessed to have the one of the best coaching staffs around." St. David has won a 1A best 12 state championships.

No. 14 Fredonia (5-11) vs. No. 3 Baboquivari (13-3): Congratulations go out to Baboquivari, which is making its first ever playoff appearance and also won a region title for the first time. Before this season, Baboquivari was 32-181-2 in the past 13 seasons. "The region title and trip to state has generated much pride in the Tohono O'odham Nation," coach Pete Delgado said. "The entire team and coaching staff are all enrolled members of the Tohono O'odham Nation." Baboquivari will lose only one senior this season. The Jose brothers, P/SS Zach and P/INF Anton, who are each hitting .579, according to maxpreps, are leading Baboquivari's turnaround. Fredonia dressed two seniors, five juniors, three sophomores, and two freshmen this season. It is coached by a former Fredonia player Derran Tait. Fredonia won a state championship 50 years ago.

No. 11 Mogollon (10-12) vs. No. 6 Superior (12-9): Mogollon opened the 2017-18 campaign with a 13-7 loss to Superior. Jr. Seth Reidhead has stolen 18 bases and is batting a team-high .400. So. Timmy Porter, Jr. Trey Tenney and Sr. Cameron Krug each have 20 RBI's or more for Mogollon. This season, Superior, the defending champ, is young and learning how to win. It lost five regular season games by a run and two by two runs. "It hasn't been very smooth this season," coach Manuel Ortega said. "We have had a lot of ups and downs.

With all of that, what has kept us above .500 is our never give up attitude." This is the fifth consecutive

year Superior has reached the playoffs. Spearheading this year's postseason team are Jr. SS Jesus Castellanos, Jr. INF/P/OF Steven Ybarra, So. INF Gabe Otero and INF/P Kale Major (.414 ave).

No. 10 Joseph City (10-14) vs. No. 7 Hayden (8-10): Joseph City has started three freshmen all season, including Avery Buckley, Joseph City's leader in RBI's (30) and second leading hitter with a .500 average. "Our team has grown throughout the season and has been resilient through the adversity of an eight game losing streak while playing 3A and 2A quality baseball teams," third-year coach Shawn Layden said. "I only had two returning seniors and four returning starters." Despite being a somewhat young team, this is the third consecutive season the team has reached the playoffs. Seniors Jesse Hulsey (.516 ave.) and Rance Haddox (.479 ave.) and junior Cameron Baldwin (.470 ave.) are helping guide Joseph City this season. Hayden has also experienced its share of struggles, on and off the field, this season. "We somehow find ways to get through our tough times together as a team," coach Robert Lorona said. "We are not the most talented team out there but somehow we find ways to win. These players never guit and neither does my coaching staff. We are with them every step of the way." Lorona played for his dad, Bobby Sr., from 1996-99, winning a state title in 1997 at Hayden. Rudy Lorona and Gabby Aguirre used to coach under Bobby Sr. and this year came out retirement to coach with Lorona Jr. "Pitching is key for us," Lorona said. "Our pitching is led by Mario Mariscal, Robert Borhn and Omar Lopez. We just try to put the ball in play on offense and try to put pressure on the opponents."

No. 15 Rock Point (9-12) vs. No. 2 Ray (17-3): Rock Point finished its regular season winning six of its past eight games. It only won 15 games between 2006-2016, but has won 21 games in the past two seasons under head coach Andrew Sanchez. Ray lost in the semifinals last year, in the quarterfinals in 2016 and in the championship game in 2015. "Our main group has been together for five years now," third-year coach Francisco Lechuga said. "We have a very talented freshmen class, which added some competition and encouraged all to work harder to compete for open spots in the lineup." Lechuga said seniors Fabian and Richard Valenzuela (4-1, 1.63 ERA, .468 ave.) and juniors Jaden Pace (.446 ave.) and Anthony Lopez (.442 ave.) have been instrumental in keeping the team focused.

2A Baseball Tournament Preview

Phoenix Christian beat Willcox 9-2 last year to claim the 2A state championship. It was the fourth state championship for the Cougars but the first since 2003. The team is 22-5 this year, good enough for a No. 7 seeding. Let's take a look at some of the top seeds this year beginning with No. 1 Gilbert Christian.

No. 1 Gilbert Christian (22-0): The Knights are entering the 2018 playoffs with an unblemished record, 22 wins in all. The Knights have outscored their opponents by an average of 15-2 with nine shutouts thrown in the mix. Senior Nick Hershey is batting .648 with 30 RBI, 19 doubles, eight triples and three homeruns. Sam Mominee is hitting .619 on the year with 31 RBI and fellow senior Alec Blakeman is batting .571 with 34 RBI, 14 doubles, three triples and five home runs. Hershey also has 24 steals and Nominee has 19. Hershey leads the team from the mound with a 9-0 record with 122 strikeouts in 49 innings of work and Blakeman is 7-0.

No. 2 Willcox (16-2): The Cowboys took second place last year which was the best finish for the program since the Cowboys won three state championships in a row (1999, 2000, 2001). Adrian Fuentes is in his first year with Willcox after serving as an assistant coach for several years.

"This year we have some strong leaders with five starting seniors and three starting juniors and we have a solid battery when it comes to our pitching and catching," Fuentes said. "Our biggest leader on the field and at the plate is senior Sherrick Sanborn. He is currently our number one pitcher and is leading the team in batting average with .509. He is followed up by senior first baseman Kade Norris (.481) and junior infielder and number two pitcher Eli Madrid (.466). Our catcher, Junior AJ Fuentes is batting .405."

Fuentes was a player on the three straight championships.

No. 3 Bisbee (22-4): The Pumas made it to the quarterfinal round last year. Junior Eduardo Vasquez is hitting .603 with 35 RBI and senior Javier Ballesteros is batting .484 with 27 RBI. Vasquez is 9-1 from the circle and Eddie Alvarez is 7-3. The Pumas enter the playoffs on a 12-2 streak with the two losses coming to Willcox and Benson.

No. 4 San Tan Foothills (24-4): The Sabercats made it to the quarterfinal round last spring. Ryan Sutterby is in his second year with the program and he is 46-11. Freshman Trevyn Badger is batting .582 with 26 RBI with 12 doubles and four triples. Badger also has 36 steals on

the year. Senior Norman Touey is hitting .477. Badger is 7-1 from the mound and fellow freshman Jason Reyes is 4-1.

No. 5 St. Johns (21-3): St. Johns was eliminated in the first round last year as a 14 seed. Senior Joseph Ramsey is batting .529 with 20 RBI and 14 doubles and sophomore Tate Skousen is hitting .455. Senior pitcher John Robertson is 8-0 with 68 strikeouts and Ramsey is 5-1

No. 6 Joy Christian (18-7): The Eagles were the top seeds last year, but the team lost to Willcox in the semifinals, 5-4. The program was state runner-up in 2016.

"Our team has been through a lot," said head coach Klent Corley. "We lost five players a few weeks before the season and we lost our catcher a few weeks into the season. Our kids have been really resilient and have handled tough situations well. This team is much different than years past. Rather than rely on talent, they have had to find new ways to win games. All but one player is playing a new position or is in their first year as a starter. I am very proud of them winning the region because it took a ton of work from our guys. They could have spent the year pouting about what could have been, but instead they knew they had to step up to help their team win. We have had our ups and downs, but I am very proud of how they have competed. I hope that we can help get them playing their best baseball heading into the playoffs."

Corley lists sophomore Ronan Kopp and senior Nick Ayres as two of his leaders along with senior Jake Pitner and Mason Rhynard.

No. 7 Phoenix Christian (22-5): The Cougars are returning state champions. Mark Band is in his 15th year with the program.

"Our seniors are our team leaders," Band said. "Steven Cochran, Kyle Janes, Adrian Santa Cruz and Tyler Turk. Steven, in particular, has been a great leader and is our team captain."

Sophomore Nate Gulick is batting 540 with 34 RBI, Santa Cruz is 6-1 from the mound and Cochran is 7-3.

No. 8 Morenci (11-11): The Wildcats missed the playoffs last year. Joseph Morse has been the head coach for four years.

"Team leaders this year are seniors Michael Ortiz at third base and Derek Waltrip in centerfield," Morse noted. "Waltrip is also our leadoff hitter who gets the team moving. Junior Desmond Sandoval (6-1, 74 K) and senior David Corona (4-2) have done well this year pitching as well. Catcher Antonio Gallegos has been a leader behind the dish"







Casteel May Be Team to Beat On Way Out of 3A

With a burgeoning school population that's been an impetus to a couple of state titles in other sports this year, it wouldn't be surprising to see Casteel come away with this year's 3A state title. The Colts are moving up to 5A next year when it will house four full classes for the first time, not just freshmen, sophomores and juniors.

The Colts breezed through the Metro Region unscathed (although not the strongest of 3A regions) and defeated several playoff contenders outside the region. Casteel's only loss to a 3A school was in February to Florence. The Colts returned the favor a month later. Nothing is a certain in baseball and one-off game can pop up at any time. Casteel enters the tournament having won 11 games in a row and 20 of its last 21. The lone loss in that span was to a 6A school.

Here's a thumbnail sketch of the top 12 seeds as the tournament begins Friday May 4 with the first three rounds set of the Surprise Sports Complex:

#1 SABINO: The Sabercats have enjoyed a proud tradition that has waned a bit before the last two seasons. Once a power in 5A and 4A, this is the second year in a row they are in the playoffs. Sabino was a perfect 12-0 and won the South Region, which has four of the 16 teams in the state tournament. Coach Mark Chandler, in his second year after coaching at Sahuaro for 13 years, puts his team's strength at pitching and defense. Junior shortstop-pitcher Preston Clifford sports a .392 average and is 7-0 with a 0.86 earned run average. Senior pitcher Tyler Wiltshire is right behind at 8-0 with a 1.26 ERA. The team's top hitter is junior third baseman Andres Villasenor (.406, 2 HR, 26 RBI).

#2 CASTEEL: The Colts are in their third year of existence and second with a varsity team. Coach Matt Perisho carries 11 juniors, eight sophomores and three freshmen and has started the program from the ground floor. Perisho has been impressed with the leadership of team captains Marcus Lucas and Conor Hatch. Dan Galvin is a player to watch and hitting .432 as is Lucas. Brody Wagner is having a break-out season hitting behind Galvin with a .453 average. A steady player in the infield is shortstop Eli Ludwig. The Colts have five pitchers with between three and five wins and have divvied up the innings among them nicely. Nine pitchers on the staff have worked between 10 and 34 innings. Casteel was


one-and-done last year and Perisho is counting on a deeper showing with the experience that's in tow.

#3 SAHUARITA: The Mustangs were runners-up in the South Region. They are led offensively by senior Saul Escarrega (.486 average, 31 RBI and 9 HR). Junior Jose Dicochea is a dual threat batting .477 with 28 RBI and 15 extra-base hits. On the mound he is 6-0 with a 1.17 ERA. He misses bats with 63 Ks in 42 innings. Freshman Devin Alvarez has been a welcome addition batting .404 with 30 RBI. There's pitching depth with Chris Barraza (5-2, 0.84 ERA).

#4 FLORENCE: The Gophers are reeling a bit from an injury suffered almost two weeks ago by head coach JT Neal. Neal was struck in the face by a batted ball and has undergone surgery for the various fractures. Neal, who is in his fifth season at the school, says the Gophers formula for success revolves around pitching first, good defense and timely hitting. Pitcher-shortstop Mat Olsen has thrown two no-hitters -- a seven-inning one and a five-inning run rule. Matan Utschen has slammed five homers and catcher Tyler Austin leads the conference with 26 walks. Walter Sommer has the top batting average at .486. Florence has six baseball titles in its history.

#5 NORTHWEST CHRISTIAN: The Crusaders are the defending conference champs and are attempting to defend with new coach and former major league pitcher Bob Howry. Howry, a standout in his prep playing days at Deer Valley, has lots to live up to with the school's recent postseason success -- two titles, a runner-up and quarter-final finish the last four years. NWC finished runner-up in the West Region to Chino Valley. NWC is led by seniors Jarin Davis and Dylan Smith. Davis is the staff ace with a 1.22 ERA, 4-2 record and has recorded 70 Ks in 46 innings. Smith leads the team in most offensive categories, starting with an average of .412. Replacing a lead-off hitter and clean-up hitter were question marks to start, but have been filled admirably.

#6 HOLBROOK: The Roadrunners are a top-eight seed and East Region champ under first-year head coach Kendall Bakurza, who assisted for seven years prior. Bakurza has a top-heavy roster of seniors (9) and juniors (2) who returned from last year. Seven of them were starters. Holbrook was the top seed last year and lost in the first round to Empire. The team is hungry to atone and have tried a more focused approach offensively.

Pitching and defense have remained solid. The Roadrunners are led by senior infielders Frankie Ulibarri (.381, 6-1, 3.74 ERA) and Cole McDaniel (.418 avg.) and senior outfielder Ryan Short (.419 avg).

#7 CHINO VALLEY: The Cougars come to state with a West Region title to their credit and pitching their forte. Coach Mark Middleton terms senior Tyler Hixon and junior Abdiel Sanchez as dual aces. Two players sport averages of .400 or better (Hixon .464) and (Sanchez .429). Five are hitting .300 or better. Chino lost seven seniors to graduation, but a nice mix of classes (7 seniors, 4 juniors, 3 sophomores and two freshmen) has led to another region title. Chino is looking to turn its postseason fortunes around of late. The Cougars have lost in the first round each of the last three years.

#8 CATALINA: The Trojans were red hot to begin the season reeling off a school-record 19 wins in a row before Sabino snapped the streak. Coach Shane Folsom is in his 10th year. He likes his pitching starff with five players getting regular work. Phillips (9-0), Michael Romero, Jon Lerma (4-2), Villalobos(4-2) and Musser have ERA's between 1.11 and 2.51. Defense and timely hitting have augmented the pitching. The top seniors among nine are

Charles Stewart, Jack MacDonald, Aaron Folsom, Alex Phillips, Viny Rifici, Frank Villalobos and Cameron Musser. The school's last winning season was in 2011, which just happened to be a state title season.

#9 SAFFORD: The Bulldogs reached the finals last year bowing to NWC. They finished runner-up to Florence in the Central Region. Pitching is strong as evidenced by junior Curtis Bevens play-in game win over Window Rock, 13-3. Bevens is 7-0 for the year with a 1.43 ERA. He's not a huge strikeout guy, but his numbers illustrate his effectiveness. Offensively the leaders are Austin Villalba (.453), Jerick Aribizo (.387), Patrick Ornelas (.385) and Mason Duros (.350). Villalba also pitches.

#10 SHOW LOW: The Cougars tied with Holbrook and Payson for the East Region crown, but it went to Holbrook due to tie-breaking procedures. Show Low is a strong hitting team with five players who see regular time hitting .400 or better - Cal Fawcett, Tanner Isaacs, Jake Reidhead, Zach Edwards and Grayson Pace. Defense has been a problem at times, but must be shored up in the tournament if the Cougars are to make a run. Isaacs and Deegan Letner are the top hurlers in terms of work and have ERAs in the low to mid threes.

#11 PAYSON: The Longhorns are making their sixth consecutive playoff appearance under sixth-year head coach Brian Young despite losing eight seniors. They lost to Safford in the semifinals a year ago. Those seniors were mostly the starters from a year ago. This team is young, but has learned to be successful quickly. Top pitchers are Kevin Cerna and Koy Duran. The offense revolves around first baseman Dylan Justice and outfielder Jesse Conway.

#12 EMPIRE: The Ravens may have finished fourth in the South Region, but the others ahead of them occupy the #1, #3 and #8 seeds. They have quality hitters in junior Braden Boisvert (.456 avg., 18 2B, 5 HR and 35 RBI), senior Luis Quintero (.409 avg., 6 HR, 30 RBI) and junior Matt Smith (.416 avg.). They'll need to hit as pitching isn't especially strong. Nine pitchers have win, but no one has more than three. Seniors Tanner Duffek and Drake Bannerman have logged the most innings -- and have three wins apiece.
