### IA State Championship Volleyball Mogollon, Anthem Prep Are the Favorites

The 1A Conference girls volleyball state tournament is a twoday affair, beginning with the Nov. 3 first round and quarterfinal matches at North High School in Phoenix.

On Nov. 4, the tournament concludes at the same site, with the 3 p.m. championship match. Fans can watch the championship match online (http://www.nfhsnetwork.com/events/aia/eb9a946d5f) on the National Federation of State High School Association's network.

### 1A CONFERENCE STATE VOLLEYBALL 1ST ROUND PREVIEW

No. 1 Mogollon (17-7) vs. No. 16 Fort Thomas (12-10): Mogollon is led by senior captains Chealynne Franco and Jodie Maner. "They are very uplifting leaders and returning starters," coach Theresa Kelton said. "Our two juniors, Lauren Hancock and Mackenzi Willis, are seasoned setters and have led our offense for the past three years. The success of our season is based on team goals and motivation. We have a seasoned team. We have 12 girls that just love the game and each other." Hancock is hitting .302 and is averaging 3.3 kills per game. Five Mogollon players are each averaging at least more than one kill per game. The team's service percentage is 91.8, and Makenzie Willis has a team-high 49 aces. Mogollon returned all of its offensive weapons from last year's state runner-up team and has not dropped a single game to a 1A team this season. Mogollon lost the 2016 title game to St. David in five games, and defeated Fort Thomas 3-1 in last year's state semifinals. Senior outside hitter Robyn Olivar and junior setter Rebecca McCabe are Ft. Thomas' floor generals. "The qualities Olivar and McCabe contribute to the team are encouragement to teammates, community, integrity, and all-around great attitudes," Ft. Thomas coach Alyssa Ponder said. "Our team became successful due to our communication with one another, our need to work hard and practice more on our weak points.

No. 9 The Gregory School (14-6) vs. No. 8 Bowie/San Simon (14-2): TGS' captains are junior middle blocker Anna Valencia, senior outside hitter Elena Acuna and senior libero Cameron Moore. "Anna consistently leads by example, working as hard as she can at all times," coach Angela Earnhart said. "Elena is our speaking captain who helps her teammates on the floor when there's confusion. Cameron is the spirit of the team, always ready to pick up a fallen teammate and get them back on track." TGS had to overcome the loss of setter Rachel Gonzales and a libero to ACL injuries at the start of the year, so it took the team a while to regain their confidence, Earnhart said. Junior Acacia Reeder, an outside hitter at the start of the year, stepped in "big time" as the team's new setter this year. TSG has made the playoffs every year during Earnhart's 4-year tenure. Setters Cassie Rourke and junior Nyomi Hernandez are Bowie San Simon's leaders. "Both girls also do an outstanding job as our outside hitters," coach Kari Wade said. "They are all-around athletes who work hard in the season and out of season to be strong and are team driven. They bring a sense of stability and intensity to the team, which pushes their teammates to play their best." There are no seniors on Kade's squad, which starts three freshmen, Aubrey Jones, Tay Diaz and Karissa Thayer. "These girls had to step-up and into some senior shoes that were hard to fill from last season and have done a great job," Wade said. Bowie and San Simon are two different high schools but join forces during the high school season because of their small enrollment totals. But the girls have learned to play for each other. "They truly love the game of volleyball," Wade said. "They rally each other and have learned to laugh at the good and cry with the bad. They bring determination and

patience to the game and also to each other." Bowie/San Simon won only three matches from 2010-13, but has won 28 matches since Wade took over in 2016.

**No. 5 NFL Yet (16-3) vs. No. 12 Ash Fork (23-8):** NFL Yet is 36-9 in the last two years under coach Alan Rascon. Senior Florizet Romero (1 block average per set) and Maryann Hernandez are averaging a combined 4.9 kills per game. Senior Elisa Cardenas has tallied 70 aces. Junior Clarissa Maldonado, Hernandez and junior Adrianna Sharp are each averaging 9.7 digs or more per match. OH/DS Karen Canela, last year's 1A leader in hitting percentage and total digs per set, is Ash Fork's captain. Canela (3.5 kills per game) and defensive specialist Shaelynn Cauthen are the seniors on Ash Fork's 9-person roster. Canela, sophomore Evelyn Acosta, junior Andrea Tellez, junior Maggi Cisneros, and junior Jasmine Ayala each have 46 or more aces this season.

No. 4 Valley Lutheran (23-11) vs. No. 13 Mayer (10-7): Valley Lutheran hasn't won 23 matches in the previous nine seasons but did so this year despite starting six new players. "Our success is because of a good junior varsity program," coach Randy Krieger said. The team only carries two club players. The team did suffer a big injury this season, though. Senior captain Jazmyn Rodriguez, a libero, was a three-year starter but is out with an ACL injury. The team now plays three juniors, four sophomores and a freshman most of the time. Juniors Alena Haro-Orlando (2.8 kills per game) and Alixus James (69 aces, 8.5 digs per match) and freshman Rianna Haro-Orlando are handling the leadership duties. "Alena leads with her play, Alixus with her effort, and Rianna runs our offense," Krieger said. Sophomore Kayla Rodriguez is averaging 11 digs per match for Valley Lutheran. Kym Reid guided Mayer to the playoffs during her first two seasons as head coach. Mayer has won six of its last seven matches and only dropped five games during that stretch. Libero Cambree Swink, outside hitter Alexus Williams and setter Charlie Sweetland are the only seniors on Ray's young team.

No. 3 St. Michael (19-4) vs. No. 14 Ray (13-5): The captains of St. Michael are its offensive weapons, Delila Lakaidinae and Jalynn Smith, senior setter Sherilynn Herrera and senior MB/OH Paige Laughin. "We have a well-rounded team," coach Andrew Ashkie said. St. Michael returned five starters from last year's state semifinal team. "We have great chemistry on the team," Ashkie added. "Other players have stepped up to fill the spots on the team. We have played in tougher tournaments (Monument Valley, Chandler Prep) this year as well, which has helped with growth and team mental toughness." St. Michaels suffered a couple of injuries at the start of the season, but the team is now healthy. St. Michael's has made it to the semifinals the past two seasons with the help of nine players who are seniors this year. If St. Michael and St. David meet in the quarterfinals, it'll be a rematch of last year's state semifinal match, won by St. David 3-1. Rachel Mawson is in her first season with Ray as the head coach. Five of Ray's 12 players are either freshmen or sophomores and has had only one sub .500 season in the past seven seasons.

**No. 6 St. David (16-7) vs. No. 11 Rock Point (14-8):** St. David's volleyball program's history is strong, having reached 13 state championship matches. Head coach Tylene Miller has claimed two of St. David's seven championships victories, including last year's 1A title. Senior outside hitter Kourtney Trejo and sophomore middle blocker Jaylin Richardson, the team's No. 2 hitter last year, are St. David's leaders. Richardson, a MB/OH, and Trejo (3.5 digs per game) are each averaging more than two kills per game. Richardson also is St. David's leader in blocks with 55, and senior Claira Freestone is second with 36. Junior Daisy Merrill runs the offense for St. David, which is back in the playoffs despite losing seven seniors from last year's team. Senior outside hitter Chloe Beach and senior middle blocker Taylor Johnson led Rock Point to its third consecutive playoff berth. "Chloe has been keeping the team together by talking with the team during practices and games," Rock Point coach Melvin Arthur said. "She is able to work with all the team members and the team listens to her. Taylor also talks with all team members and encourages them to work and play hard every game. She motivates the team." To gain more experience this season and to prepare for the playoffs, Rock Point played in more big school tournaments this year. "This group of girls have been playing together for the last three years and have developed good chemistry," Arthur said. "They support one another and push themselves during practices. The hard work they have done has made them a competitive team."

No. 7 Williams (15-6) vs. No. 10 Shonto Prep (17-7): Williams graduated a couple of big hitters in the previous seasons but senior middle blocker Tori Maebe and sophomore opposite Maegan Ford stepped up this season, coach Chesney Grantham said. Senior outside hitter Anna Chaney was one of the big surprises this year for Williams. "The success has come with a lot of hard work being put in by the girls," Williams coach Chesney Grantham said. "They're all dedicated to the program and have worked hard at every practice, every drill, every day. Each player has been fully committed to our team and its show in their matches." Senior outside hitter Riley Heap (96 kills) and senior middle blocker Paige Kmetz helped take charge, allowing Williams to win 10 of its final 11 regular season matches. "Paige and Riley have shown maturity on and off the court, giving our other girls guidance and encour-agement," Grantham said. "Following in their footsteps is sopho-more setter Madi Olson. Madi has improved as a setter and has taken on running the offense for the Vikings." Williams has totaled 220 aces so far. Seniors Tori Maebe and Carlene Chaney each have more than 100 kills. "I have a young team of sophomores, juniors and two seniors," Shonto Prep coach Justice Beard said. "The success that this team has is due to the players bringing a wealth of volleyball experience. This experience involves playing club during the summers and the enjoyment of the sport. It's been

a great year for Grizzly volleyball, and we will continue to work toward excellence, academically and athletically." Shonto Prep had a winning season for the time in the past three seasons thanks to winning 10 of its last 12 regular season matches. Five players are averaging one kill per game for Shonto Prep, which also has 205 aces. Benally leads Shonto Prep with 72 blocks.

No. 2 Anthem Prep (16-11) vs. No. 15 North Phoenix Prep (12-5): Anthem Prep reached the playoffs for the first time last season as an AIA member and won its first match before bowing out in the state quarterfinals. The team recently lost its quarterback, Madelin Hadlock, Anthem Prep's best defender, to injury but the team was still able to beat No. 4 Valley Lutheran without its leader. "My middles and outside hitters have worked hard on defense all year and were able to play both the front and back row successfully without a libero," Anthem Prep coach Raymond Wrublik said. Along with Hadlock, senior setter Mackenzi Kaul is a captain. "We have two good middle blockers (Jenna Timmerman and Georgia Vallery) and a good backup in Dayton Busch," Wrublik said. "Two very impressive hitters who can pound the ball are Jenna and Kelly Moczulski. When we serve, Kara leads the team but all are able to go on long serving runs. We also have three good setters (Mackenzie, Nicole Shibata and Gabriella Garces). On defense, all of the starters are able to play all the way around and play solid defense. Madeline has done an outstanding job all year on defense. We have rotated her with all front row players to give them a break during the game. Having her out for the playoffs will make it difficult to give the players any rest." Anthem Prep and North Phoenix Prep faced off in the open-ing match for both teams, with Anthem Prep winning 3-0. NPP's volleyball program made its debut last year with a 1-14 season but turned around its program quickly with a very young team. Junior outside hitter Kris Perez (82 kills) is the only player that isn't a freshman or a sophomore on NPP's roster. They might be very young but NPP is somewhat tall, including 6-foot freshman Abigail Schwartz. Two freshmen, Emily Lister (leads NPP with 138 kills) and Sofija Brnovich (52 aces), are also a threat.





### 2A VB: State Favorite Scottsdale Christian Locked in Under New Coach

Scottsdale Christian's smooth transition to a new coaching staff and proven talent allowed the Eagles to soar the top of the 2A Conference rankings and No. 1 state tournament seed this season.

"They are a hard working group of kids," said first-year coach Kim Ohlinger of her Lady Eagles. "Of the 10 players, six are national club players. Three of them will be going either Division I or D-II. On the court, they have a calm confidence."

They also want to file a different ending to their high school volleyball journey.

Last year, Scottsdale Christian was quietly fuming after losing a 3-game state semifinal match to a team the Eagles swept in the regular season. In stepped Ohlinger, the third head coach in the past four seasons for the school.

But the girls were well-acquainted with Ohlinger, last year's junior varsity coach and also former middle school coach for some of the players. Like her players, Ohlinger is very driven and focused, allowing the new coach and players to mesh seamlessly.

After its second consecutive 30-plus win season, the ambitious Eagles are absolutely performing like they are ready to win the program's first title since 2006. The three matches Scottsdale Christian dropped this year were to 6A Conference top-10 schools Mountain Pointe and Sandra Day O'Connor.

Scottsdale Christian lost two regular season tournament matches to Mountain Pointe, the only 6A school that's defeated 6A's No. 1 state seed, Xavier, this season. But the Eagles haven't dropped a single game in their last eight matches, as opponents have had trouble neutralizing Eagles' seniors Lexi Schamadan and Kalli Bentz, juniors Lauren Ohlinger and Emma Whitehead and freshman Sophia Wadsworth.

Schamadan (University of Central Washington), Ohlinger (Boise State) and Whitehead (Wisconsin) are Scottsdale Christian's college bound players. It's rare for a 2A program to have three D-I or D-II players. Whitehead, a libero/defensive specialist, leads the team in digs and serve percentage (96.5).

Ever since she could remember, Ohlinger said Whitehead's goal was to get an offer from her dream school, Wisconsin, where she attended a couple of camps. Lauren, Kim's daughter, and Schamadan are tough to block pin hitters.

Combined, Lauren and Schamadan, the team's kill and ace leader, have seven seasons of varsity play. Wadsworth, a middle, solidified the team and front row when she joined the program.

"(Wadsworth) has gained so much strength and confidence in herself on the court this season," Ohlinger said. "Sophia has a bright future ahead of her. There's no limit for this middle blocker."

The hitters and middles tend to get most of the accolades, but there's no arguing who the backbone of the team is—Bentz, a 4year varsity player and coach on the court. Bentz runs Scottsdale Christian's 5-1 offense and on occasion the bench.

During a game in which the Eagles trailed 19-11, Bentz took it upon herself to call a timeout and requested to talk to her teammates without the coaches present in the huddle.

mates without the coaches present in the huddle. "I totally respect that," Ohlinger said. "They did their timeout led by the captains, and we went on to win the game 29-27. It was crazy."

Win a title and Scottsdale Christian will surely go bonkers.

The first round of the 2A state tournament begins Nov. 3 at Arcadia High School, which will host the quarterfinals and semifinals as well.

### THE FIRST ROUND

No. 1 Scottsdale Christian (31-3) vs. No. 16 Chandler Prep (17-23): Chandler Prep won eight of its last 10 regular season

matches. Eight of the players are either sophomores or freshmen. The team's serve percentage is 92.7. Senior Taylor Mantle leads Chandler Prep with 6.6 digs per set, and her 662 digs rank third in the state.

**No. 8 Phoenix Country Day (15-8) vs. No. 9 Pima (17-8):** The leaders for PCD are OH Nikasha Patei (National Merit semifinalist, 4-year starter), Kylie Fisher (S/RS, 4-year starter), Wynne Beyersdorfer (DS, 4-year starter), and Payton Darago (S/RS, highest kill percentage and ace total). "Our team has been successful this year because of the understanding of our game plan and total commitment to the team," PCD coach Kat Burrell said. "We don't have any super stars on our team, but we have hard workers and girls who buy into what we need to execute and win. We play tenacious defense, serve tough and try to be aggressive with balls we send over the net." The captains for Pima are seniors middle block-er Cassidy Brimhall, MB Jessica Sherwood and OH McCall James. Sherwood and Brimhall are each averaging more than three kills per game.

**No. 5 Glendale Prep (26-6) vs. No. 12 Benson (14-6):** The captains for Glendale Prep are sophomore setter Caitlin Kao and senior middle Issa Martell (3.0 kills per game). Kao leads the state with 143 aces. Junior outside Jessica Vargas is averaging a team-high 3.6 kills per game. Junior Brittney Shawel is collecting 9.4 digs per match. For Benson, the team has won nine of its last 11 matches. Kayla Harguess, Benson's fourth head coach in the past four seasons, guided her program to 14 wins for the first time in the past four seasons. A freshman, Emily Darwin, is Benson's leading hitter. Brittany Barney has 56 assists for Benson.

**No. 4 Thatcher (19-7) vs. No. 13 Round Valley (15-9):** "The girls have done very well adjusting to the new coaching staff," Thatcher coach Kim Orr said. "It was rough losing our first three matches, but it showed us things we really needed to work on. The girls worked hard and improved so much. By working together, believing in themselves and their teammates, and staying positive they've been able to come from behind and win sets that seemed out of reach. One in particular was against Safford. We were down 17-24 and came back and won 32-30." With a first round victory, Thatcher will win 20 matches in a season for the ninth time in the past 10 seasons. Taya Baldwin, Maddy Underwood and Kaitlynn Rasmussen are each averaging 2 or more kills per set.

No. 3 Trivium Prep (23-7) vs. No. 14 St. Johns (14-6): Trivium Prep has reached the playoffs in each of its three seasons as an AIA member. The team shifted some players to new positions this year with great success. "We have had a successful season due to a roster full of team players," coach Beth Wilson said. "There isn't one player who tries to shine above the others. They each go out there striving to play their very best and working their very hardest for the good of the team. They play with intensity and with heart and they have been incredibly good at controlling what they can control.' Trivium Prep has five seniors who lead in their own different way. "Mandi Ojeda plays with a quiet confidence and keeps the team poised and even," Wilson said. "Kylie Rusick plays with contagious, high intensity. Audrey Stewart is the heart of the team with her enthusiasm and positive attitude. Mercedes Flickinger helps keep the team focused with her calm demeanor and perspective. Kate Smith has a way of encouraging team unity and support." This is the sixth consecutive season that St. Johns has finished with a winning record. Elizabeth Moore is in her first season as coach. St. Johns has won 10 of its last 11 matches. Ten of its players are eithers juniors or seniors. Abbie Overson leds the team with 124 kills (4 per game). Senior Cassidy Crosby had 177 digs after playing in 31 games.

**No. 6 Veritas Prep (23-6) vs. No. 11 Arizona Lutheran (30-11):** Veritas Prep coach Emily Lindley has known some of her players since they were elementary students in Lindley's class. "This year's end of season will be especially difficult," Lindley said. "I really feel a strong bond to this group. It will be hard to see them go. I am so proud for each of them and all their accomplishment on and off the court." Veritas Prep has won three titles since 2008 and has had a winning record in 10 of its last 11 seasons. Despite missing a couple of starters for different reasons during a couple of matches this year, the team gained some confidence for the remainder of the season, Lindley said. This season, the team read Jon Gordon's Hard Hat, 21 Ways to Be A Great Teammate, the basis of the team's laser focus this season. Six sophomores have contributed to the team's success this season. Seniors Katie Coulter (libero), outside hitter Jacalyn Sharko and middle Tia Hamann are the leaders. Last year was the first time in the past eight years that Arizona Lutheran didn't reach the quarterfinals. In 2014, the program won the D-V title and lost in the 2015 semifinals. "We have five excellent senior leaders this year who all contribute greatly to the team,' coach Brad Bode said. "RS hitter Hayley Meshay stands out the most. She is an amazing offensive weapon and will take her skills to UTEP next year. Seniors Sarah Turner and Nicole Chavez rule the back row while seniors Hailey Pedersen and Bekah Stahmann do their damage at the net. I'd characterize this entire team as extremely hard-working with a never-quit attitude. Last season the long rallies ended with us losing the point. This year we win those points."

### No. 7 Arizona College Prep (16-4) vs. No. 10 Tempe Prep

(12-13): ACP's leaders are its captains, senior Lucy Hoffman and junior Daria Sukhareva. "They bring experience and intensity to our team," coach Heather Orr said. "Lucy and Daria are consistently dependable and our players can rely on them to make game-changing plays." The team's floor general is sophomore setter Julia Golichowski. "ACP's success stems from our team-centered focus and pursuing John Wooden's vision of the Pyramid of Success," coach Heather Orr said. "We give our best to be the best team we can possibly be. Our players understand that each individual plays a critical role on our journey. They accept that each of them have to give 100% of their efforts 100% of the time, and our focus is never on W's or L's. Our focus is being the best team we can be." The

majority of the team's practices are under 40 minutes. "We value balance," Orr said. "Because ACP is so academically focused, we are determined to keep the focus on what is important." Tempe Prep's leader is the "humble" Mary Shroll, a Division I college libero playing middle blocker at Tempe Prep. Shroll's .532 hitting percentage and 585 kills lead the state, according to maxpreps.com. "She is a total rock star and a joy to coach," Dyer said. Tempe Prep got off to a slow start but has won seven of its last nine matches thanks in part to transfer Gretchen Hoefer's defense and three "amazing" freshmen. Tempe Prep defeated 6th seed Veritas Prep and 8th seed Phoenix Country Day during the final stretch of its regular season. "I believe the reasons behind this are the multiple strong underclassmen, and it doesn't hurt to have who I believe is the best player in Arizona, who gives 110 percent every day," Dyer said.

No. 2 Horizon Honors (33-4) vs. No. 15 St. Augustine (19-5): Horizon Honors, the defending state champ, went undefeated in three invitationals, Estrella Foothills, PCDS Desert Classic and Black Canyon Invitational, it attended this year. Valley Christian transfer Cici Collins is the school's record holder for kills in a season. "The reason why we are successful is, because I feel we play our best as a team," coach Kris Maglunog said. "We really do have a balanced offense, having four players with triple digit kills. Our defense is one of the strongest aspects of our game, forcing good teams to make errors in the long run. Though we have lost three times this season, we have always bounced back by using these losses as learning opportunities for us to grow offensively, defensively and mentally. We work hard in practice day in and day out to out-team our opponents." The floor leaders are senior OH Erica Kendree, a 4-year varsity player, junior MB Liv Moran, the "voice" of the team, libero Gabby Castronova, and OH Cici Collins. Maglunog's program has won 29 or more matches in each of her three seasons. St. Augustine tied the school record for wins in a season. Junior MB/OH Ariana Navarrete is hitting .324 and is averaging 4.2 kills per game. Sophomore Brianna DeVries' 139 aces ranks second in the state.



### Snowflake, NW Christian Tough to Beat for 3A Crown Fountain Hills, Blue Ridge Also in the Picture

The 3A Conference playoffs will start on Friday, Nov. 3 with the championship scheduled for Saturday, Nov. 4 at North High School. The first round, quarterfinal round and semifinals are scheduled to be played at Camelback High School.

Let's take a look at top four seeds in the 3A Conference. All records are based on power-ranking matches:

**No. 1 Snowflake (17-0)** ... The Lobos went undefeated (10-0) to win the 3A East Region and that mark includes two wins against No. 4 Blue Ridge, although the Yellowjackets took the Lobos to five sets in both losses.

"I have several leaders," head coach Alan Ramage said. "My seniors are just great leaders and different than any in the past. I have Erin Willis, who is a calm and yet a great contributor. She is on the leaderboard in many of the offensive categories and I have a libero Makayla Ramage, who is a quiet leader as well. These two girls are the quietest girls I've ever coached. They have a business-like attitude in matches, which I think is very calming for the team."

When asked about his team's success, Ramage added, "I believe it is because of their hard work and just the amount of time they put in the gym and weight room. Another huge factor is that these girls love each other, and have played together for over six years."

The Lobos recorded a semifinal finish to Northwest Christian last year and the program has four state championships to their name with the last coming in 1996.

**No. 2 Northwest Christian (17-0)** ... The Crusaders went undefeated (10-0) to take the 3A West title. The Crusaders entered the 2016 state championships as the top seed and took second place to Fountain Hills. The school has 11 championships with the last coming in 2013.

Freshman Reagan Hope leads the team with 231 kills and seniors Grace Fen and Kendall Nagai are also leading the attack with over four kills a set between them. Senior setter Roth McKenna has 411 assists and freshman Emma Harmeyer has 303. The Crusaders have only given up two sets in their last 14 matches dating back to Sept. 14 and those two sets came during an invitational held in San Diego.

Northwest Cristian beat No. 3 Fountain Hills 3-0 way back on Sept. 5.

**No. 3 Fountain Hills (15-2)** ... The Falcons went 10-0 to win the 3A Metro Region. As mentioned before, the one conference loss on the team's overall record came against No. 3 Northwest Christian at

home. Fountain Hills won the Marana Mountain View invitational held in the Tucson area in early October with huge wins against Mountain View, Pueblo, Tucson, Catalina Foothills, Flagstaff and Thatcher.

"Our three captains are seniors KC McMahon, Amara Feyrer-Melk and Paula Iwaoka," head coach Peter McGloin said. "This is their third year together on varsity, and they bring a lot of wins and experience to the court, as well as a great understanding of how we want to play the game.

"Paula communicates so well leading our defense and all three of them are doing a great job encouraging others and keeping us together."

Speaking on winning the Lion's Den in Tucson, "The depth of our team has been very helpful this year as we've managed injuries most of the season. We just got everyone back and playing together for the first time at the Lion's Den Invitational. We have a lot of offensive weapons and our serving can be very tough. We also have a lot of experience back from last season's state championship team. I think another big reason we're successful is that we play very hard and for each other most of the time."

Fountain Hills won the 2016 championship for the second title in school history.

**No. 4 Blue Ridge (14-3)** ... The Yellowjackets took second in the 3A East Region behind Snowflake. The two region losses, if you recall, came against Snowflake, with each match going to the full five sets. Blue Ridge also has a loss to No. 13 Florence. That loss was a 3-1 decision on Sept. 12.

The Yellowjackets did not make the 3A state playoffs last year and the team finished runner-up in 1974 and 1980.


"My main leader is Shelly Newman," second-year head coach Lori Clarey said. "She is the best overall volleyball player on the team. She attacks, sets, blocks, passes, serves, and defends as well as, if not better than, anyone on our team."

Clarey also lists senior outside Marlee London as her other important leader in the program. "I would call her a 'gamer' meaning she is a fierce competitor who has an incredible drive to win," Clarey added. "She typically has stepped it up in big matches for us."

The Yellowjackets have overcome a few obstacles according to Clarey.

"We were making way too many errors at the beginning of the season and giving away easy points to good teams. We have really been focusing on playing clean and smart volleyball and knowing when we have a green light, yellow light, or red light, in terms of how aggressive and tricky we can play."


