GIRLS WRESTLING IS A PARADE OF CHAMPIONS TEN INDIVIDUAL CHAMPS FROM LAST YEAR RETURN, BUT WEIGHT CLASSES HAVE BEEN REDRAWN

The weight classes shifted, the number of weight classes offered have been changed and the venue for the state championships are equal to that offered to the boys. There has been plenty of positive movement in girls wrestling in Arizona, and it's only going to get bigger and better.

Only 10 weight classes were recognized in 2019, the first year the AIA held a statewide wrestling championship for girls. There were no team scores offered that inaugural season, but the sport was up and running and former Shadow Ridge standout Lexi Borunda became the first state champion ever in the 101-pound weight class.

The same 10 weight classes were offered again in 2020 and Sierrah Thrun of Corona del Sol, Carolina Moreno of Kofa and Mia Didur of Centennial became the first wrestlers to win two individual championships in Arizona history.

2021 brought us a leap forward with 14 weight classes offered and programs began competing for a team championship for the first time in Arizona history. Basha came away with the first state championship in the sport's history and two more wrestlers added their names to the list of two-time state champions in Goldwater senior Bree Garcia (2020, 2021) and Naomi Norton of Arizona Lutheran (2020, 2021).

Garcia (24-1) has a chance to be the first girl from Arizona to win three state championships and she is competing in the 126-pound division. Liberty sophomore Taylor Colangelo (42-2) beat Garcia at the Section VII championships (Dec 5-4) for her only loss. This will be one of the most anticipated matches in the state.

Including Garcia, there are 10 returning champions but with a twist. The number of weight classes offered for competition this year has been reduced from 14 to 12 so earning a spot on the steps at the end of the night will become that much more difficult.

The team competition was held at Mesquite High School last year but all competition is slated for the Arizona Veterans Memorial Coliseum this year for both boys and girls. The girls will wrestle all day on Friday, Feb. 18 and then again on Saturday with the championship round scheduled for Saturday night.

Basha is still in the mix to repeat but Liberty qualified six wrestlers for state while Casteel, Westwood, Sunnyside, Winslow and Basha had five. Chavez, Hamilton, Mesa and Poston Butte will bring four.

Bisbee junior Adacelli Noriega (14-1) became the first wrestler from Southern Arizona to win a state title in 2020 as a freshman but Bisbee did not compete last year due to COVID restrictions. Noriega was unable to defend her title but she's back this year. Sunnyside standout Audrey Jimenez (9-0) won her first title last year and the sophomore is currently ranked No. 1 in the country in her weight class. She will be making a strong case for four individual titles but she has to get this one first.

Jimenez is one of a handful of undefeated wrestlers including Bella Bocenagra of Liberty (100: 36-0); Adriana Barron of Washington (107: 20-0); Audrey Jimenez of Sunnyside (107: 9-0); Riley Davila of Winslow (114: 26-0); Jussiah Bamba of Peoria (114: 20-0); Andie Donahue of Valley Christian (120: 9-0); Mylei Seigla of Canyon del Oro (132: 31-0); Isabelle Munoz of Casteel (132: 34-0); Jamie Laswell of Cesar Chavez (132: 7-0); Isis France of Sunnyslope (132: 33-0); Shi'anna Bamba of Peoria (138: 22-0); Taliyah Armstrong of Westwood (145: 32-0); Issis Stevens of Kofa (145: 22-0); Genesis Higuera The Odyssey Institute for Advanced and International Studies (152: 21-0) and Nina Sandoval of Campo Verde (165: 12-0).


If the weight classes and records hold from sectionals to bracketing, the 132-pound division with Seigla (31-0), Munoz (34-0) and France (33-0) clashing at some point along with Laswell (7-0). The 145 weight class has Stevens (22-0) and Armstrong (32-0) competing and the 114 weight class has Davila (26-0) and Bamba (20-0) competing.

All four divisions on the boy's side will take to the floor of the Coliseum with the girls during the Parade of Champions prior to the championship final. There were eight sectionals this year for the girls and each section sent the top two qualifiers in each weight class if possible to make up the 16 spots on the championship bracket. The top six wrestlers from each weight class will earn a medal.
