O'CONNOR AIMS FOR THE SWEEP IN BEACH

News and notes for some of the top pairs entries into the Division I tournament.

ARCADIA: "As a team, our 1s have a strong work ethic and good court awareness," coach Jackie Bunker said. "They serve well, and they are strong in two-down defense. Rylie Sieben and Leslie Bugg are both 3-year varsity beach players. They are committed to growth and raise the level of competition at our practices."

CORONA DEL SOL: "Kierstyn Barton and Dominique Wofford are both athletic and move very easily on the sand," coach Ben Maxfield said. "They can play with power, but have developed a lot of finesse with their hitting choices. When their serving is on, they are tough to beat. Ella Lomigora and Taylor Erickson work hard to make their partner better. They are very positive and don't get rattled or down when things aren't going their way. They will grind to the very end."

DESERT RIDGE: "They (Lucci Alexander, Caprice Lorenzo) gelled together from day one last year," coach Justin Sherrill said. "They both have very high volleyball IQs, and they anticipate their opponent's moves to make scoring opportunities easier. Caprice has been a scholar athlete all four years she has been at Desert Ridge. She is going to play for Hawaii's beach program next year, but was able to get an academic scholarship. They have gone 24-0 over the last two years. It was nice to go into most duals knowing that we most likely only needed to win 2 other matches because they were almost an automatic point for our squad. Caprice will be greatly missed as a player and person. We are glad that we have Lucci for two more years."

HAMILTON: "Camille DiSalvo and Skye Lower are one of the most incredibly positive partnerships you'll ever witness play," coach Ryan Wrublik said. "Their energy is infectious and incredibly supportive of each other. Because of their great belief in each other they are not easily rattled and just enjoy competing together. They have both been true leaders in our program and we would not be half the team we are without their outstanding support, encouragement, and leadership!"

MESA MOUNTAIN VIEW: "Briley Decker and Reece Fischbeck are very driven and have such a high volleyball IQ, individually and as a partnership," coach Heide Hoops said. "They are willing to take the tough shots and push themselves in practice and in games. Reece is a junior who at-

tended a primitive camp for two months living off the land and is no stranger to hard work. Briley is a senior who is committed to playing volleyball at Brigham Young University for its indoor volleyball team. Together, these two are such a driving force of the team as they elevate the whole program. Lexi Williams and Rachel Reed are each self-motivated and always give full effort whether it be in practice or competition. They will do whatever it takes to compete well and win. They have an energy and compatibility that is hard to match. They are fun to watch and their love for playing the game is visible to all. They always hustle for a ball and are smart with their strategy. These girls make up a huge part of the team and bring the program to a higher level."

PERRY: "Avery Burks and Jordan Saun have been playing together for three years," coach Fred Mann said. "They are the prototypical blocker/defender. Avery is the blocker at 6-1, and Jordan was the AZ indoor defensive Player of the Year. Both are D-1 level indoor players. Jordan is headed to Air Force and Avery is still deciding. Both could play on D-I beach programs."

MILLENNIUM: This year we have a young No. 1 team,” coach Priscilla Tallman said. “Bella Martinez is a freshman with a couple of year of beach experience and training outside of high school. Bianca has done a great job anchoring the team with leadership and highly competitive experience in both high school and club. This pair works well together, trusts each other and communicates well. Bianca’s beach experience come mainly from playing high school, but her mind for the game (both indoor and beach) helps her to make decisions and communicate to her partner. She has a passion for the game of volleyball and both she and Bella love to compete. Bianca will be graduating 7th in her class with at 5.35 weighted GPA in our IB program. She will continue her education and playing career at New Mexico State University. Bianca has served as a captain for our beach team for two years, she is a quiet leader who displays what it means to be a Millennium Tiger. We have loved having her leadership on this team and in the 1’s pair for two years. She will certainly be missed next year.”

SANDRA DAY O’CONNOR: “Our No. 1’s, Sydnee Broadway and Margo Smith are one of my most competitive but quiet players we’ve had,” coach Jamey Spartz said. “They don’t show frustration or being upset. They just do their job. They just focus and are coachable and reliable. They have the skill set and game knowledge and have learned how to adapt and adjust. Sydnee is so fun to watch. She’s such a mature athlete. It’s like she’s been playing for years. She make the game look so easy. She has no ego. Margo is quiet. Everybody loves Margo. They look up to her. She’s a quiet leader. She doesn’t show disappointment.”

QUEEN CREEK: “Elle Evers has been training in the sand since she was 10 years old,” coach Stefany Pew said. “She currently trains with the beach club Volley For Life and has really become a student of the game over the years. Izzy Mahaffey has been playing volleyball since she was 6 years old. She specializes as a libero indoors for the AZ Storm, but has played club sand since she was eight with Volley For Life and currently Beach 48. Due to playing both for as long as she has, her court awareness is some of the best I’ve ever seen and not just for her age.

Elle has been attending multiple college camps across the country where she is actively being recruited by many. But her most recent big accomplishment is that she was invited to be a part of the USA Beach National Team Development Program this Spring. Izzy has won multiple beach tournaments such as taking Gold for the AVP Championships in Manhattan beach in 2017, and many more since then. And indoor, her most recent accomplishments were winning the Open National Championships last year with her Storm 14’s

team, and currently as 15’s. They have won two major qualifiers in Utah and Vegas. Elle is a sophomore in our program and has already paved the way for the future Bulldogs to come through our program. She turns heads wherever she plays and is well known in the sand community due to her hard work and dedication to the sport. Izzy might be only a freshman, but her leadership and example is felt and known by all. She is undoubtedly going to push our program to be more and more successful throughout her high school career.”

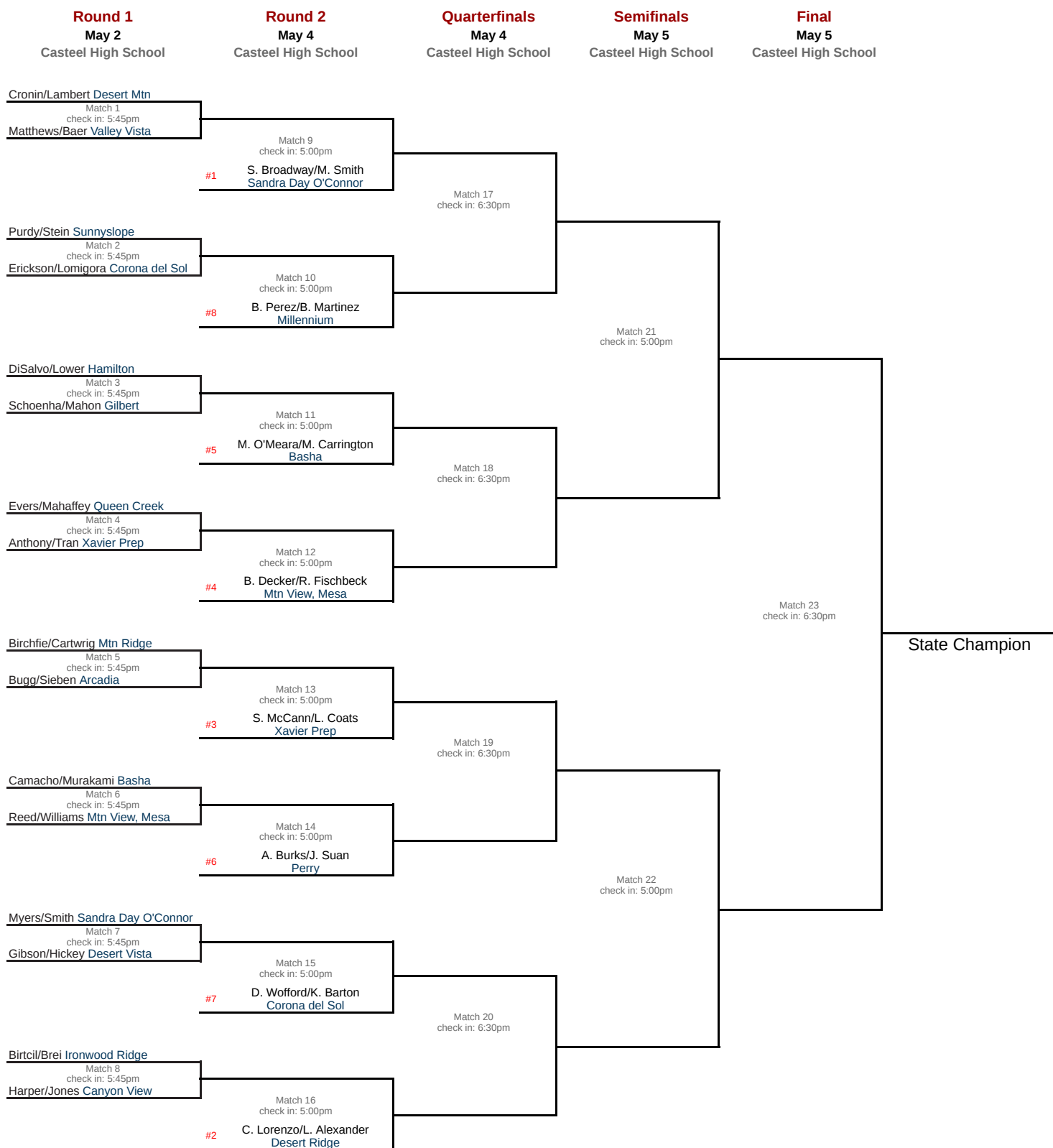
SUNNYSLOPE: “This is the first year sophomore Andie Purdy and freshman Georgi Stein have played together,” coach Amber LeTarte said. “These 2 have grown tremendously this year playing together. They are a controlled team with a ton of potential. Andie brings years of beach volleyball experience and insight, and Georgi brings untapped skills with a desire to get better every time she plays.” Purdy carries a 4.62 weighted GPA and wants a career in STEM. “Over the last few years I have been in AAU nationals, AVP America Nationals, BVCA nationals, and Junior Olympics.” Stein has a 4.5 weighted GPA and was a 6A indoor honorable mention, All-Region First Team and All-House of Payne Tournament Team member. She also a member of the school’s choir. “My goal is to continue playing volleyball in college, hopefully at a D-I university,” Stein said. “I plan to attend camps this summer to learn more about what that looks like. I will continue to make school and my grades a priority these next three years. I may want to pursue nursing as my mother is a nurse and it’s been a great career for her to raise four kids. I look forward to my sophomore year as a Viking.”

VALLEY VISTA: “Senior Sam Baer has committed to Stevenson for sand and has over a 4.0 GPA,” coach David Chavez said. “Sam also helps with Unified Sports and has a passion for that. Marielle Ramos is a freshman has played in many sand tourneys and has qualified for Nationals. The future is great for both. Sam has been a part of the sand program all four years and is such a driven and incredible athlete and will be missed”

VALLEY CHRISTIAN LOOKING TO GET ITS DUO BACK ON TOP FOR FIRST TIME SINCE THE INAUGURAL PAIRS TOURNAMENT

News and notes for some of the top pairs entries into the Division II tournament.

ALA GILBERT NORTH: “Dissy Brinkerhoff and Brooklin Bogle were our starting outside hitters on our 3A semifinal volleyball team,” coach Steve Crook. “They both have club sand experience as well as school ball. Brooklin is a senior and has been offered a sand scholarship by the University of Utah. She has chosen to attend BYU-Idaho next year. Dissy has been playing sand for most of her life and is a highly ranked 16U player locally and nationally. They were 11-0 as a pair for the season. Brooklin was 14-0. They seem to have a knack for playing their best when it is most needed.”

CANYON DEL ORO: “Madison Navarrete and Kylie Strang have ball control and experience even though neither are seniors,” coach Ryan Call said. “They also both excel in the classroom and play on travel indoor teams. Both are hard-working, are great leaders, have played varsity as freshman. So they are unfazed by big situations. They’ve played in a lot of three set matches for us.”

CHANDLER PREP: “I think the attribute that makes Ashlyn Unruh and Zoe Yates play well is that they have been playing together for years,” coach Anthony Jones said. “Both of their families have known each other for a long time, so they grew up playing with each other and have been together on the beach team for the last three years. They are both even keel and never get too high or too low and know each other so well they can speak to each other without speaking. Both students have a 4.83 weighted grade point average, and Zoe is an avid violin player who takes lessons that cause her to miss practice on Monday’s since she is that good. For our program they were the defined leaders of our team as juniors and were looked up to by all the girls on our team. They did well to lead the program with almost all new girls who have never done beach.”

DEER VALLEY: “Our No. 1’s pair is so successful this year because of Emee Fellens,” coach Kathryn Coleman said. “She has been on the beach team for four years and is definitely our team leader. She plays club beach at Grayhawk and will be attending South Mountain CC to play beach volleyball. Her partner this year, Sam Gloria, is a sophomore who is an outstanding indoor player. She plays club volleyball at a National Level. They work well together as a team and I hope that they can finish this season strong.”

ESTRELLA FOOTHILLS: “Sage Chittester and Raegan Moran are two of the hardest working kids I’ve met in 25 years of coaching,” coach Steven Pond said. “Their attributes that makes them our No. 1’s are their skill to play aggressive at the net as well as their ability to adapt to their opponents. They are two athletes with a high IQ, which makes pre match planning, mid-match adjustments a luxury. Both ladies are phenomenal teammates and great leaders to our program. They are the true definition and example of student athletes. Raegan is a First-Team All-Southwest Region Selection and First-Team All 4A Conference selection in indoor volleyball. She has an overall 4.35 GPA.

Sage is a Second-Team All-Southwest Region selection in indoor volleyball and currently has an overall 4.55 GPA.”

MESQUITE: “We have an interesting pairing in the playoffs,” coach Carlos Flys. “We combined a freshman (Bella Reyes) with a senior (Hailey Hanna) for our 1s this season. Bella is very mature for her age and acts like a senior in many ways, so the age difference is not a factor. Both players are very self-confident and they both look forward to the challenge of playing top players in the state. Bella and Hailey have also embraced the program’s culture where you are selfless

and play for your team instead of just for yourself. This has allowed them to help teach the younger, less experienced players on the team."

NOTRE DAME PREP: "Junior Lindsay Ritz is 3-year varsity athlete and has competed at the 1 and 2 seed her entire career," coach Jamie Walsh said. "She has always been a leader with confidence on the court." Ritz has a 9-6 overall record and is 1-1 in the playoffs. "The attributes that make me successful is always pushing through," Ritz said. "Even when facing a hard team, I believe trying and fighting for every point is better than giving up." Emma McSorley is freshman playing in her first year as a varsity player. "She immediately made an impact on my team after moving here from Hermosa Beach, CA," Walsh said. McSorley also made the Dean's List, had a 9-4 regular season record. She plays indoor for ND JV and Storm Volleyball Club. "She has a great attitude and is a ball of sunshine," Walsh said.

SAGUARO: "Our No. 1 pair at Saguaro, Lexi Lentz and Maya Skrodenis, are successful because they both have solid ball control and complement each other well," coach Tim Church said. "Maya, a sophomore, does not have the experience, especially in beach compared to Lexi, but she is a strong offensive player who is able to take advantage of Lexi's hand setting. Lexi is an experienced beach player with a high beach IQ and a variety of shots in her repertoire. Both are great, supportive teammates. They are both outstanding students, with Lexi having a 4.58 GPA and Maya having a 4.86 GPA. Due to events outside their control, they were only able to play eight matches together this season, but their ceiling is high and we are excited to see how well they can play after this extra couple weeks of practices before the pairs tourney."

SALPOINTE CATHOLIC: "For our No. 1's, Emma Hugeback and Jalynn Ransom, talk about improvement," coach Heather Moore said. "They dropped a three setter early in the year but have improved. That didn't let them get them down. They keep fighting and leading our team. They are awesome girls and supportive of each other and their teammates. They are good hard-working girls and don't let the losses affect them. Francesca Pieroni and Sophia Hernandez have done a good this year. (They are both 17-0). They haven't dropped a set. Francesca is one of the most physical girls in sand, and Sophia is a setter on the indoor team. It's a true beach volleyball pairing, with a big and a small. They work hard and are evolving and moving forward."

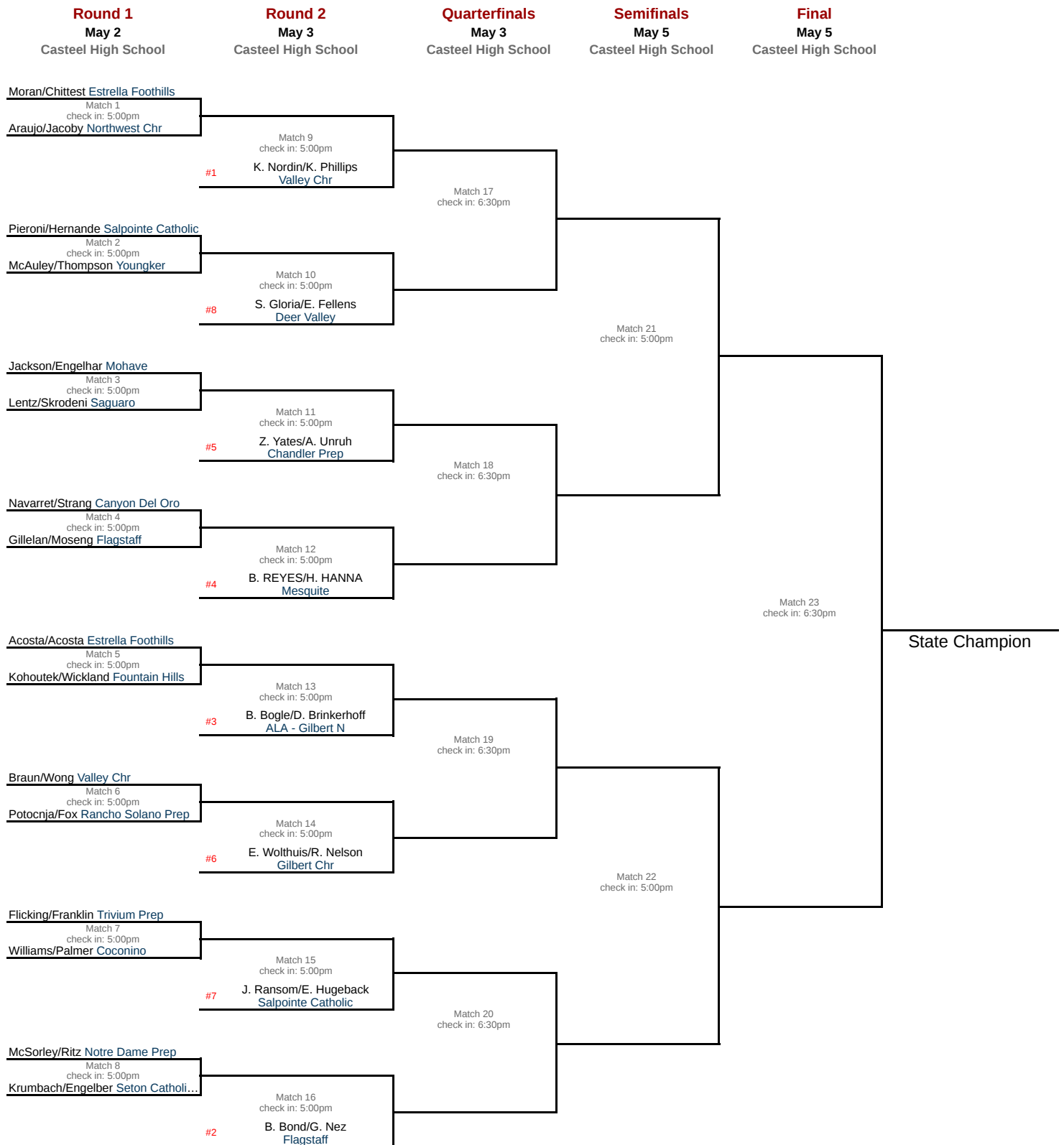

Kate has verbally committed to play beach volleyball at U of A, while Korah is continuing to navigate the recruiting process and reviewing offers."
