Previewing the 2022 state tournament

Perry is 100-1 since 2017. And now Lerina Johnson isn't "begging" students at her campus to play badminton for her anymore.

The pleading is now probably coming from other corners, wanting Perry to stop winning.

Good luck with that. Once Johnson got Perry's badminton dynasty rolling, stopping it became one of the toughest high school tasks in Arizona.

The season, the Division I top-seeded Pumas are seeking to extend their state record badminton championship win streak to six. Perry has made it look easy (100-1 record since 2017), but that wasn't always the case.

Johnson took over Perry when it opened in 2007.

"I literally begged for years for kids to play," Johnson said.

The driven coach looked inward to help Perry's badminton fortunes turn.

Johnson stashed away her competitiveness for something else.

"Girls have to have fun to win," Johnson said. "I had to change my coaching style. I had to be flexible. It was slow, but I had to change myself to get the athletes to come and stay."

The breakthroughs came during the 2014 and 2016 runner-up seasons, Perry's first team title appearances.

After that, the winning accelerated. In 2017, four softball players joined Johnson's program, and they recruited others to join Perry's badminton transformation

That year, Perry badminton claimed the school's first team state title in any sport. The winning and the fun haven't stopped since.

Now, 40-50 female and male players attend open gym badminton sessions, Johnson said.

"All of our sports have gotten to be so good at Perry," said Johnson while explaining further why her program has blossomed. "It's hard to make a team and intimidating to try out for a sport at Perry. Badminton is different in that they don't have experience when they come here. So a lot of people try out because of not having the pressure of it, and they didn't have to play club or have prior experience. Kids want to be involved in high school. And we give them that opportunity." The numbers are up, but Perry has been challenged as of late.

Last year, Chaparral handed Perry its lone regular season defeat since 2017. But Perry avenged that loss with a 5-0 victory over Chaparral in the D-I 2021 final. This year, during a tournament, Perry lost to Hamilton. But Perry closed its 2022 regular season campaign with a region title after defeating Hamilton 5-4, clinching the No. 1 state seed.

This year, Perry returned only one player from last year's championship starting roster. But this year's starters have waited three years for their turn to star.

Perry's No. 1 this year, Emma James, is 25-2. "She's a strong leader," Johnson said. "She will greet you with a smile every day and find the good in her game, win or lose, and find the good in anyone else. James leads Perry's talented squad, which is also comprised of Amiya Hernandez (25-2), Vienna Morley (24-4), Oanh Le (25-3), Robin Bui (20-4), and Talisa Chafey (21-3). Chafey and Bui, Perry's No. 3 in doubles, clinched their team's match against Hamilton on Oct. 18 with a two set victory. "We are going to be challenged at state," Johnson said. "You betcha. And

that's OK. Like I said before, I love the sport and the fact that it's getting better and more competitive is a good thing."

Division I Team Notes

Hamilton: The Huskies only won eight team matches during the previous two seasons but are 13-1 this year. "Our success this year is attributed to some great upperclassmen leadership and returning the majority of our varsity team from last year," coach Lauren Rosales said. "These kids work hard, push each other, and cheer each other on. It's been amazing to see their hard work paying off. Samiya Bodhankar and Saba Shakir are the leaders. They are competitive, compassionate, and consistent. They push everyone on the team to be better." The team's GPA is 3.82, and every rostered player has a 3.7 GPA or higher. Samiya is very active in DECA, a marketing program. Saba switched from volleyball to badminton halfway through her high school career and is an active member in Hamilton's National Honors Society. Nihira Sane is a dual sport athlete. "She's a phenomenal runner and will be a competitor on our track team in the spring," coach said. Sahasra Pechetty performs Bharatanatyam, a form of Indian classical dance and had to miss a badminton tournament for a statewide event. Melanie Lee and Sevrina Bunch are members of the school's Women in Stem Club. Brooklyn Tallman is the junior class president. Rosales also coaches varsity softball team at Hamilton.

Sunnyslope: Sunnyslope is 12-2 this season. The team's leaders are senior Maddie Schlesinger and junior Sabrina Case. "Maddie is a captain and our number one and leads by her work ethic, fun attitude, drive for success and ability to bring the team together," veteran coach Sarah Schlesinger said. "She has played varsity for three years and has proven she is up for any challenge that comes her way. Sabrina is a junior and our No. 2 who also leads by example with her amazing attitude and work ethic. Our team is very strong academically. Maddie and Carli Liesener are top ranked seniors on our team."

Corona del Sol: The Aztecs are 11-3. The team's captains are Merilyn Li and Allie Pequeno. "Both have been a crucial part of our program and have played on the team for Corona for 3-4 years," coach Katie Pick said. "These two have leadership qualities that their teammates look up to and define them as leaders. They have a lot of knowledge of the game, are willing to teach other girls, have positive attitudes, strive to get better with each practice and are competitive. Merilyn plays outside of school at the AZBC Badminton facility as well. She has played in the AIA state tournament for all four years of high school and was state runner-up last year." Every player medaled either first, second or third in the Bye Bye Birdie Tournament. "On top of that, we have carried a lot of girls the past two seasons who have created the team comradery/friendships on the team," coach said. Corona del Sol has quite a few girls taking AP and honors classes and are involved in numerous clubs. Li is currently ranked No. 1 in her senior class of 762 with a 4.857 GPA. "At the beginning of the season, one of our player's mothers was diagnosed with breast cancer," Pick said. "She is new this season, and the girls have really gravitated to her. The player and I created Breast Cancer Awareness shirts for the team and we all wore them to support her journey and those who are fighting the fight."

Basha: The Bears are 9-4 this season. The leaders of the team are Jordyn Mee, coach Warren Mee's daughter, and her doubles partner, Tricia Despain. "Both are excellent straight A students and great athletes," Warren said. "Amazing leader-ship and role models for all the younger players." Mee and Despain are undefeated in doubles and will likely be the favorite in the D-I doubles state tournament. They have defeated Perry and Hamilton's No. 1 doubles teams. They also won the Chaparral Firebird Invitational, playing teammates in the finals of that tournament. Mee has a 4.56 GPA. Basha badminton currently has the highest team GPA average on its campus. Mee teaches badminton at the Arizona Badminton Center to kids 6-12 years old and volunteers at the Maricopa Library. Mee's older sister, Alexis, played for Chandler High for 2014-17. Chandler High badminton coaching legend Lois Emshoff is an assistant at Basha and has been coaching badminton since 1973. Xavier: The Gators are 9-5 this year. The team's leaders are Gigi Riviere and Sarah Castlen. "They both bring very different leadership qualities to the team," coach Brian McNerney said. "Gigi is a classically trained badminton player and her knowledge, play, guidance, and advice on in-game tactics is extremely valuable to her fellow teammates. Sarah on the other hand is a very vocal leader. She has organized a big sister/little sister program, leads stretching and cheers, and demonstrates tenacity and a never quit attitude. Both of them develop strong character and technical skills amongst our younger players." The team has held its own against some of the top tier teams in its region. Another big accomplishment is the emergence of two sophomore stars, Maggie Henry and Corinne Ladha, who have played strong competition and carried themselves remarkably well against top tier varsity talent, coach said. Lexi Garman is a physics and math "savant" and is currently flourishing in AP Physics 2. Riley Dowdall and Ava Hilsabeck "are remarkable young women who are juggling a challenging schedule complete with Honors and AP courses while maintaining a GPA higher than 3.7." Henry and Ladha are completing honors, AP and advanced math courses with GPAs of 4.0. "I've been very lucky to inherit young women who are extremely strong academically," McNerney said. "All of our seniors are extremely talented in the classroom and juggle a very impressive class schedule." The team will volunteer at a local soup kitchen to help distribute meals this year.

Red Mountain: The Mountain Lions are 8-6. The team's leaders are seniors Olivia Moya and Kennedy Burns along with juniors Julia Moya and Chelsea Stevens. "The biggest attribute they possess is a great attitude and a competitive drive," coach Jake Kober said. The team has been ranked in the top-10 this season despite losing four player from last year's semifinal team. "The new varsity girls have done a tremendous job in their new roles along with our two returning varsity players," coach said. Olivia Moya, Julia Moya, Chelsea Stevens, Victoria Montenegro and Kennedy Burns are all killing it in the classroom, Kober added. "Once our season concludes we would like to get down to the junior highs and elementary schools to introduce the game in hopes of growing the game of badminton," Kober said. Highland: Becky Woo, Ashley Lund, Lainey Jones, and Brynna Smith are the team's leaders. "They are all four year players who know what is expected from them and the rest of the team," coach Derrick Donaldson said. "All of our players do well in the classroom. All of the varsity players are above a 3.5 GPA. Lainey is an awesome track runner and has a state title in the last three years on the track." Highland is 7-6 this year.

Dobson: Dobson was 5-8 last year but is 10-4 this season. One of the team's leaders is Journey Barajas, a senior. "Journey is our No. 1 player for the second straight year," coach Henry Bribiescas said. "She puts in endless time of practice at the Badminton Center and receives offseason individual instruction. Journey sets the tone for us and plays with heart and determination. Hannah Martinson, a senior, is our mental leader. Hannah is the player who makes sure everyone is ready to play and truly cares about each individual player and their well-being. She sets hard standards for herself both on and off the court and expects the most from her teammates." This is the second time in Bribiescas' six years that Dobson has reached the playoffs. Dobson's roster is filled with seniors, including six who have been with the program since they were freshmen. "It has been great to see them grow up and mature as a player and person," coach said. Hannah Martinson is one of the top students at the school and involved in many school activities. She's has been in honors classes since her freshman year and has academic scholarship offers "through the roof." Her goal is to become a doctor. "Hannah is one of the most selfless young persons I have ever coached," Bribiescas said.

Mountain Ridge: The Mountain Lions are 7-7 on the year. "Teagan Pereira leads by hustle, kindness and respect," coach Timothy Rosinbum said. "Teagan has an impressive serve and good touch around the net. Megan Moreno helps with all the little tasks and makes excellent suggestions. Megan has excellent speed on the court and solid power. Maranda Rogers gets things done and always seeks to improve. Maranda hits some impressive drop shots." Mountain Ridge beat a tough Desert Vista team on the road and we have battled against a tough schedule. Lilah Zafar and Sophia Grabham are doing very well in numerous honors and AP classes. I also teach AP US History," Rosinbum said. "Lilah and Sophia are dedicated and tough students in the class, and both are excelling."

Division II Team Notes

Ironwood: The Eagles are the two-time defending Division II champs. The team is currently 13-1. Its leaders are C'asia Handy and Melanie Flores. "C'asia has worked very hard on shot selection and movement on the court," coach Brett Stafford said. "She is a very positive person and leads by example. Melanie has worked on her mental game and is a take charge person who is always wanting to help others that are having trouble with an aspect of the game." Ironwood won its region for the eighth time despite playing with an inexperienced group. The team's GPA average is about 3.85.

Verrado: At 14-0, Verrado just completed its best regular season under coach Candice Wadding. "I am lucky to have an special group of seniors who have been on the team for three years," Wadding said. "Kenadie Woodhead and Lauren Thrasher are seniors and above all great leaders for our program. They lead by example and have exceptional work ethic. Paige Ginsberg is also a senior and is always up for a challenge. Her first year of badminton was last year, and she instantly stepped up to the plate and became a key varsity player. Currently, we have girls that play varsity softball, tennis and soccer here and outside of school in club. Our team is extremely athletic and their success on the court is due to their hard work and commitment to our program." The team's No. 1, Mathilde Jacobson, is from Denmark, hasn't lost a set this year and has played competitive badminton for seven years. Kenadie and Mathilde are undefeated in their doubles No. 1 matches. Lauren and Paige are also undefeated in doubles at No. 2. Kenadie has a 4.0 GPA and also plays varsity tennis. Kyria's GPA is 3.83 and competes on a competitive traveling softball team. Lauren and Paige verbally committed to play softball for Glendale Community College. Kelsie Kamp is a varsity cheerleader and competes in skills USA. "All of my athletes compete in other sports, which is why I feel our program has been so successful," Wadding said.

Arizona College Prep: The Knights are 13-1, with its only loss coming to undefeated Prescott. Ashley Yang and Fatima Ahmed are the team's leaders. "They have a true love for the sport of badminton," second-year coach Andrea Giberson said. "They are both highly skilled players who want to share their skills and love for the sport with others. They spend a great deal of time working with our younger players and helping them develop their skills." This is ACP's second consecutive year with only one regular season loss. Most of the team's players are taking AP and Honors courses, sometimes exclusively. Yang started a graphic design account that documents her progress as a self-taught UI/UX designer. She volunteers her time creating logos, web/app prototypes and social media posts for non-profits and small companies. Her Instagram handle is @ayangago.

Sunrise Mountain: The 13-1 Mustangs lost their only regular season match to Ironwood by a 5-4 score. Seniors Hattie Hearnen and Camille Martin and junior Rylan Rhodes are the team's leaders. "Hattie is a nature leader, works very hard and is willing to help others," coach Michele Carter said. "She is a natural athlete and has been a part of the program for four years. This is her second year on varsity. Camille works very hard. She is a player that others come to talk to when needed. She too has been a part of the program for four years, with this being her second year on varsity. Rylan is our number one singles player. She too leads by example. She leaves everything out on the court. This is her second year on varsity." Mabel Dinnell (GPA 3.875), Hattie (3.944), Annabel Johnson (3.875), Ruthey Figg (3.750), Camille (3.261), and Hannah Winschel (3.531) are doing well in the classroom. Figg is participating in the school's Unified Sports Program and is a coach for the Unified Class. "Ruthey is doing a great job working with both our unified athlete and their partner," Carter said. Camille also competes in Ju jitsu.

Mesquite: The team was young last year, when it won eight matches. But the Wildcats are 10-4 this season. "We still have a lot of work to do, but against well coached teams like Greenway and Campo the girls maintained their composure in close games and splits, especially our youngest varsity players, Aliana McCarey and Keira Godek," coach Joshua Anson said. "I'm also very proud of Pravindi Gurusinghe and Lillian McCullough for taking home the consolation championship trophy from their bracket at the Flying Feathers Tournament." Pravindi and Skyla Johnson are the team's leaders. "Both girls are juniors and have an incredible desire to win and help the entire team improve. Pravindi has taken her role as our No. 1 very seriously and pays attention to what the team needs and comes to practice with ideas of drills to help us improve. Skyla watches the JV girls and newer girls and helps coach them during drills because she wants to build their confidence." Danielle Malan is part of student council and choir. McKenna Galatas is on the dance company and is also part of choir. Mesquite has three very dedicated coaches in Anson, Michelle Cox and Isabella Gonzales. The three of them are also special ed instructors. Anson teaches a self-contained autism class, Wilcox is the special education office assistant and Isabella Gonzales works as a paraprofessional at Mesquite Junior High.

Pinnacle was 7-7 last year but 10-4 this season. Faith Kroenig, a junior, is a 20-8. ... Queen Creek started the year 3-7 but turned its season around, winning three of its final four matches to reach the D-I playoffs. . Prescott lost to Ironwood in last year's D-II final but was the only team to beat Ironwood (13-1) this season. It's 14-0 behind a veteran roster: Megan Townsend (27-0), Riley Crockett (25-1), Elle Long (28-0), Lindsay Carter (26-2), Lauren Farley (25-2), Callii Naylor (24-2), Breckyn Tubbs (5-1). ... Casteel finished 9-5 last year but just missed the playoffs. Not so this year. No. 1 Haylee Kuss is 17-8. ... Horizon, the No. 8 seed, beat Cactus, the No. 9 seed, 5-4 on Oct. 11. Horizon and Cactus will see each other again, but this time in the first round of the D-II playoffs. Senior Kate Ruttenberg is 16-10 for Horizon. ... Cactus' Shealyn Beaumont has a 22-5 set record. ... Coach Soncierra Louis' Millennium squad is 9-4. Sydnee Levandowski's overall record is 19-7. ... Chaparral's No. 1, Chi Chi Bracken, is 16-7.
